





Meet weekly in the Library and will soon begin a new study -a perfect time to join!




MONDAYS - 7 PM



UMM Try New Meeting Place

The United Methodist Men enjoyed the new facilities of Sunrise Terrace Mobile Home Park on Sept. 24 and enjoyed a delicious breakfast prepared by JJ's Store Deli and was furnished for \$7 per person. Tom Egan, UMM President gave an overview of recent work on the camp. The new cabins hold 14 campers each and have their own bathroom and shower facilities. This is the first time that camper cabins have had restroom facilities in the history of camp. Up to this point, those using the rustic WWII cabins had to walk to restrooms in back of the dining hall. Over \$16,000 of the \$180,000 project has come from our own UMC of AG.

The reason for the move from the hotel to Sunrise Terrace is that the hotel is now under new management and because of increased business, a room was hard to come by and meal cost had increased. A discussion was held on a site for the regular meeting dates as only the last Saturday of the month would be available at Sunrise Terrace facility. A final decision was made to hold the regular meeting at the church on the third Saturday of the month and to have a caterer do the food service. Cost would be \$9 per person.


Note from the Green Umbrella

The number of people with asthma continues to grow. One in 12 people (about 25 million, or 8% of the population) had asthma in 2009, compared with 1 in 14 (about 20 million, or 7%) in 2001. About 1 in 10 children (10%) had asthma and 1 in 12 adults (8%) had asthma in 2009. Women were more likely than men and boys more likely than girls to have asthma.

Asthma is a disease that affects your lungs. It is one of the most common long-term diseases of children, but adults have asthma, too. Asthma causes repeated episodes of wheezing, breathlessness, chest tightness, and nighttime or early morning coughing. If you have asthma, you have it all the time, but you will have asthma attacks only when something bothers your lungs.


In most cases, we don't know what causes asthma, and we don't know how to cure it. We do know that if someone in your family has asthma, you are also more likely to have it. Luckily, researchers are beginning to target specific genetic and environmental factors that may lead to asthma development.

"So far, family history is the most important risk factor," says Muhammad T. Salam, a Ph.D. candidate at the Keck School of Medicine of USC. "Genetics and how environmental factors affect these genes are key factors in asthma risk."

A new study led by Salam and others at USC found that children who carried variations in two specific genes and lived within 75 meters of a major road were up to nine times more likely to develop asthma than children who lived further away and did not carry the variations.

There are steps people can take in their daily lives to lower their risk. Smoking during pregnancy is a consistent risk factor for asthma in children, Salam says. There is also evidence that maternal diet during pregnancy can impact the risk of children developing the disease. For adults, a healthy lifestyle will help to lower asthma risk. "Don't smoke," Salam advises. "That is the main factor that people can control."

We do know that most people with asthma can control their symptoms and prevent asthma attacks by knowing the warning signs, avoiding asthma triggers, following the advice of your doctor and correctly using prescribed medicines, such as inhaled corticosteroids.

This book could change your life, by changing your relationship with money.

The Emmaus **Experience**

The Walk to Emmaus is a spiritual renewal program intended to strengthen the local church through the development of Christian disciples and leaders. The program's approach seriously considers the model of Christ's servanthood and encourages Christ's disciples to act in ways appropriate to being "a servant of all."

The Walk to Emmaus experience begins with a 72-hour short course in Christianity, comprised of fifteen talks by lay and clergy on the themes of God's grace, disciplines of Christian discipleship, and what it means to be the church. The course is wrapped in prayer and meditation, special times of worship and daily celebration of Holy Communion. The "Emmaus community," made up of those who have attended an Emmaus weekend, support the 72-hour experience with a prayer vigil, by preparing and serving meals, and other acts of love and self-giving. The Emmaus Walk typically begins Thursday evening and concludes Sunday evening. Men and women attend separate weekends.

During and after the three days, Emmaus leaders encourage participants to meet regularly in small groups. The members of the small groups challenge and support one another in faithful living. Participants seek to Christianize their environments of family, job, and community through the ministry of their congregations. The three-day Emmaus experience and follow-up groups strengthen and renew Christian people as disciples of Jesus Christ and as active members of the body of Christ in mission to the world.

The Upper Room, a ministry unit of the General Board of Discipleship of The United Methodist Church, sponsors the Walk to Emmaus and offers it through local Emmaus groups around the world. Although connected through The Upper Room to The United Methodist Church, The Walk to Emmaus
