The Kingdom of God is like a net that was cast into the sea.

Water is essential. It is used not only for drinking but for bathing, cooking, cleaning, waste disposal, and agriculture. Yet, 884 million people around the world do not have adequate access to it. In developing countries, even when water is accessible, it may not be clean. Because of this, 5,000 children a day die from waterborne diseases. What's more, 2.5 billion people around the world lack basic sanitation.

Our is church supporting the United Methodist Committee On Relief in their Water and Sanitation program. The goal is to help vulnerable communities gain better access to clean water by locating/building a safe water sources, educating communities, and improving sanitation.

Did you know that about 80 percent of illnesses are linked to poor water and sanitation conditions? In developing countries, diarrhea kills 2.2 million people each year. That's right....diarrhea! UMCOR builds latrines and hand-washing stations so that people can live healthier lives. We always couple these efforts with education about how to prevent the spread of disease.

That is a lot for one small clear liquid that we often take for granted. Our Mission Team will be hosting a **Bake Sale on July 14** after worship to raise funds for our SEC-OND well. So far we have raised \$1260.68—well cost \$4500. See page 9 "Mission News" for more info.

When there have been natural catastrophes in this country and other places, like the Sandie Storms and forest fires in the communities where we serve, you have responded through second and third miles gifts, through your prayers, and through your presence as you have volunteered to care for victims and clean up neighborhoods, here and all the way across the country and beyond. Your work with our immigrant brothers and sisters is the best organized and most extensive immigrant ministry in any conference that I have ever seen.

Our young people are amazing! I have had the opportunity to be with them at three different events since September and each time I have been so blessed. I know that you join me in being very proud of our young people. I have met with young people committed to being Transformers, gathering to learn skills for overcoming violence and bullying in the settings where they are called to be disciples of Jesus the Christ. As transformed sons and daughters of God they are living transformed lives and challenging all that stands against the values of the love and justice of the reign of God. I believe that our Spanglish Camp is raising up the very leaders who will help us overcome our decades of drought in our ministry efforts with Hispanic/ Latino people. I have every confidence that the youth who attend and are leading our Spanglish Camp will become key leaders in our achieving the goals of our conference Hispanic/Latino Ministry plan.

Our United Methodist Women, so ably led by Leanne Nakanishi and her team of officers, out of their strong historic legacy continue to lead us in missions. They are tackling such issues as human trafficking, domestic violence, climate change, and immigration all hand in hand with intentionally and diligently helping women grow spiritually. Our United Methodist Men, led by Bob Devine continue to nurture young men through Scouting, pray for all of us through their ministry of prayer advocacy, and undergird the many ministries of our local churches through their leadership and service.

All right, now that you're done reading, send it on! I think everyone should read this! 'When Satan is knocking at your door, simply say, 'Jesus, could you get that for me?'




Kits for Kiddos Fundraising Rummage Sale


Mission u: Learning Together for Transformation of the

Name Change: Lay Speaking Ministries to Lay Servant Ministries

In 2012, the General Conference of The United Methodist Church approved legislation to change the name of Lay

Speaking Ministries to Lay Servant Ministries. For several *quadrennia*, various name changes had been proposed – none of which adequately described the role of this leadership development program.

The term *servant* was chosen because it best describes what Jesus told his disciples in John 13 after he himself had performed the duties of the lowliest servant. We should be honored to serve as our Lord and Savior did. We are called to live out our discipleship as servants in leadership!

There is no change in the process of becoming a local church or certified lay servant from the lay speaker process. There was, however, a role of lay speaker added to the program that includes specific preparation and accountability processes.

Lay Speaker: Meets the requirements as listed for certified lay servant. In addition, this person must complete the required courses after the Basic Course: Discovering Spiritual Gifts, Planning Worship, Leading Prayer, Preaching, Living Our United Methodist Beliefs, and United Methodist Polity.



The Congregational Care committee has been meeting for the last three months. We have developed a mission statement of sorts that we want to share with our members. We feel we have a two-fold purpose: 1) to develop ways in which to nurture and care for our current members and 2) to develop

ways to make sure visitors and new members are made to feel welcome when they attend and that they are encouraged to become actively involved in the life of our congregation.
