Nehemiah 8:1—12

...all the people came together as one in the square before the Water Gate. They told Ezra the teacher of the Law to bring out the Book of the Law of Moses, which the Lord had commanded for Israel.

So on the first day of the seventh month Ezra the priest brought the Law before the assembly, which was made up of men and women and all who were able to understand. He read it aloud from daybreak till noon as he faced the square before the Water Gate in the presence of the men, women and others who could understand. And all the people listened attentively to the Book of the Law.

Ezra the teacher of the Law stood on a high wooden platform built for the occasion. Beside him on his right stood Mattithiah, Shema, Anaiah, Uriah, Hilkiah and Maaseiah; and on his left were Pedaiah, Mishael, Malkijah, Hashum, Hashbaddanah, Zechariah and Meshullam.

Ezra opened the book. All the people could see him because he was standing above them; and as he opened it, the people all stood up. Ezra praised the Lord, the great God; and all the people lifted their hands and responded, "Amen! Amen!" Then they

bowed down and worshiped the Lord with their faces to the ground.

The Levites—Jeshua, Bani, Sherebiah, Jamin, Akkub, Shabbethai, Hodiah, Maaseiah, Kelita, Azariah, Jozabad, Hanan and Pelaiah—instructed the people in the Law while the people were standing there. They read from the Book of the Law of God, making it clear and giving the meaning so that the people understood what was being read.

Then Nehemiah the governor, Ezra the priest and teacher of the Law, and the Levites who were instructing the people said to them all, "This day is holy to the Lord your God. Do not mourn or weep." For all the people had been weeping as they listened to the words of the Law.

Nehemiah said, "Go and enjoy choice food and sweet drinks, and send some to those who have nothing prepared. This day is holy to our Lord. Do not grieve, for the joy of the Lord is your strength."

The Levites calmed all the people, saying, "Be still, for this is a holy day. Do not grieve."

Then all the people went away to eat and drink, to send portions of food and to celebrate with great joy, because they now understood the words that had been made known to them.

sermon notes week 21

- I. The exiled people of God return to Jerusalem.
 - A. The first Group of 50,000 exiles returned from Babylon under Zerubabel.
 - B. The second group of exiles returned under Ezra, the priest.
 - C. The final group returned under Nehemiah who desired to rebuild the wall around Jerusalem.
- II. The exiled people hear the Word of God read (Nehemiah 8:1—12).
 - A. One hundred and forty years had passed since God's people had assembled as a nation united.
 - B. Ezra read the Scriptures, the Levites interpreted it and the people understood and obeyed it. (The people had lost their ability to understand the Hebrew language).

Application: The purpose of this series through "The Story" is the same.

- People need to hear the Word, understand it, and then "do it" obey.
- People can learn to communicate the whole story of the Bible to someone in 3 minutes or less. The core of "The Story:"
- God, the community of the Trinity, wants to be in community with human beings.
- Sin entered in the human spiritual DNA and destroyed the community that people had with God and with one another.
- The rest of the Bible is a story about God winning us back to Himself beginning with Abraham and a new nation and continuing with Jesus Christ and the church.
- III. The exiled people reenact the Feast of Tabernacles (Nehemiah 8:13—17).
 - A. The people recognize that God's Word calls us to do something/obey (James 1:22).
 - 1. The people cut branches and built temporary booths (tents) to commemorate the Feast of Tabernacles.
 - 2. God's Word calls us to align our lives with God's will.

Next weeks scripture references are: Matthew 1—2; Luke 1—2; John 1. OR read Chapter 22: The Birth of the King (Jesus) in "The Story."
