 - B. In Susa is a descendant of the Amalekites named Haman who hates the Jews, particularly a Jew named Mordecai.
 - 1. Saul was told to destroy the Amalekites, but disobeyed and the Amalekites were the first people to obstruct Israel from entering the Promise Land.
 - 2. Haman carried a grudge against the Jews and held a high position in the Persian Empire under King Xerxes.
 - C. Haman convinces Xerxes to decree the extermination of the Jews in all 127 provinces and whoever kills the Jews can keep the Jews' possessions.
 - D. Haman casts lots (Hebrew pur and purim), that is, he rolls the dice to determine the day to kill the Jews. The dice come up Adar 13th (March).
