

near the plot of ground Jacob had given to his son Joseph. Jacob's well was there, and Jesus, tired as he was from the journey, sat down by the well. It was about noon.


When a Samaritan woman came to draw water, Jesus said to her, "Will you give me a drink?" (His disciples had gone into the town to buy food.)

Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God and who it is that asks you for a drink, you would have asked him and he would have given you living water."

"Sir," the woman said, "you have nothing to draw with and the well is deep. Where can you get this living water? Are you greater than our father Jacob, who gave us the well and drank from it himself, as did also his sons and his livestock?"

Jesus answered, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life."

The woman said to him, "Sir, give me this water so that I won't get thirsty and have to keep coming here to draw water."



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Finance Committee has reviewed the status of our stewardship campaign and budgets for the 2014-2015 Fiscal year. We have a **serious problem**. The Stewardship campaign has brought in only **\$245,640**, **or 83**% of our goal. This leaves us over \$50,000 short of our goal and is 13% **below** last year? Stewardship campaign. Unless there is a significant increase in the *Estimates of Giving*, we will have to make some <u>serious cuts</u> in program and staffing expenses in the coming Fiscal Year.

In order to close this gap The Finance Committee recommends a three-fold approach:

- 1) We ask our Congregation to "go the extra mile" and increase their estimate of giving. Though most of our regular givers have already made an <u>Estimate of Giving</u>, we need additional giving. Unfortunately, we have a shrinking congregation. In the long run, we will need to expand the congregation. However, in short-term we ask our existing members and regular attenders to help pick up the extra burden.
- 2) Because staffing makes up almost 2/3 of the church's expenses. As in most businesses/ corporations in this economy (make no mistake, the church has to run it's budget as a business would to survive). A substantial cut in our staffing costs will need to be made to allow the current amount received keep us in the black. Finance Committee is asking Staff-Parish to come up with a plan to cut up to \$20,000 from our staffing costs. In addition, the Finance Committee is asking Staff-Parish to do a thorough review of staff pay, including hours worked and comparable compensation paid by other churches and adjust pay scales if needed. Again, this is part of a short-term solution.
- 3) The Finance Committee proposes to close the remaining gap by drawing down reserves and/or a loan from the Endowment Board.

Please prayerfully consider what God is asking of you in the ministry of what he has given you and how you are to respond in giving back to His church for the Great Commission.

We also ask that you take time to earnestly pray for our church and it's leaders as they prayerfully manage what the Lord has in mind financially and in ministry for this church.
