





He graduated from Cambridge and taught at Somersetshire College. One day while walking in the countryside he saw the green ocean, the blue sky, and the river Avon. Overcome by the beauty of the scene he wrote the words to this song. The music is by Conrad Kocher.

Originally meant for communion services of the Anglican Church, it became associated with the American Thanksgiving when it crossed the Atlantic.



Sometimes we do not recognize the things for which we should be thankful and we do not thank God enough. Viktor Frankel learned in the death camp at Auschwitz to be thankful for what he had. Prisoners there dream of bread, cakes, warm baths—things we take for granted.

Corrie ten Boom tells us her sister Betsie said to be thankful for the fleas! Why??? The fleas kept the guards away from their building in the concentration camp; therefore, they could hold prayer meetings and Bible study in it!

> God created the entire cosmos. Let us rejoice and be thankful for it!

The editors say, **God, Give Us Wings** is a captivating personal snapshot of one of the darkest periods in recent history and of the indomitable power of the human spirit. "
