## Meet Betty and Bud Johnson A SPECIAL CELEBRATION—-Married for 60 years

An interview with David Beaman 10/17/2015

The happy couple are Betty and Donald (Bud) Johnson who live in Nipomo and are members at First United Methodist Church of Arroyo Grande since 1994.

There are 27 members in their family with No. 27 being Parker who arrived last July 27th. (Betty has a hobby of Detailed Family Record Keeping.) Son Jeff and wife Sharon have three children and live in Crescent City, CA. Daughter Deborah and husband Dennis Marchiano have three children and live in Nipomo CA, and son Gregory and wife Valerie have three children and live in Santa Rosa, CA. Betty

remarked that within the parent group there are four school teachers. And now...with a new generation...they also have four great grandsons. All very interesting details that mirror the pride she has in her family.

Betty was born in Hampden, MA but later moved to East Longmeadow, MA. Bud was born in Springfield, MA and later, also moved to East Longmeadow MA., where they met while attending the Congregational Church—-and this is where they were married in September, 1955.

In 1970, Bud was transferred to Los Angeles, by McGraw Edison/Toastmaster Commercial Cooking Division and the family of five settled in Claremont, in Southern California. ### LIBRARY NEWS

At 6'6" and weighing close to 300 pounds, Phillips Brooks cut quite an imposing figure! He was an Episcopalian minister. While traveling from Jerusalem to Bethlehem on December 24, 1865, he attended a five hour service at the Church of the Nativity. Standing near the spot where it is thought Jesus was born, he felt he could hear voices talking about the wonderful night of Jesus' birth.

Three years later while preparing for the Christmas season he remembered the peaceful view of 19th century Bethlehem from Palestine at night. He composed a hymn for the children to sing. It marvels that in the dark and quiet beauty of this little town the Everlasting Light was born.

He handed the words to the church organist, Lewis Redner, to set to music. The organist felt no inspiration at first, but on the night before the Christmas program he awoke with the music in his soul. He quickly wrote it down and then fell back asleep. The next day 6 Sunday school teachers and 36 children sang "O Little Town of Bethlehem"—one of the most loved hymns of Christmas.

This information is from <u>Then Sings My Soul</u>, a book in our library, and a new book <u>The Sounds of the Season</u> by David Parker.

We also have some great Christmas DVDs:

- 1. <u>The Christmas Choir</u>—A man working with men from a homeless shelter who form a Christmas Choir.
- Joseph of Nazareth A man of faith who has to deal with the virgin birth and the challenges of protecting and raising Jesus.
- 3. <u>Bethlehem Year Zero</u>—The birth of Jesus and surrounding events as TV news would cover it today.
- The Mystery of the Three Kings—Their origins and the gifts they brought Jesus.
- The True Christmas Story—A presentation of archaeological evidence and biblical teachings, and the historical record of contrasting two kings—Herod and Jesus.

We have a copy of Guideposts "The Joy of Christmas 2015".

## REPORT OF THE MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

#### The Latest from the Trustees

Mike Johnson has contracted Executive Janitorial to strip, clean, wax and buff our Social Hall and Kitchen floors the weekend of November 20<sup>th</sup>.

Mike has received three vendor bids for maintenance of the Church's oven, refrigeration, and forced air heating systems. He is preparing final agreements for the services for the board to approve at our December meeting.

The board approved the purchase and installation of a new wall heater for the youth room.

The new building use policies the board adopted in September will be brought forth at the November Church Council meeting.

The Heating System for the Children's Center is not supplying even heat to all its room. Some rooms during cold spells are not heating up to the State required 68 degrees. It is hoped that cleaning out the vents and ducts will fix the situation. Mike will work on contacting a vendor who can perform the task.

Paul entered an authorized agreement on the Church's behalf with Ride On transportation services. They will mount a spare key box on our storage shed in return for 2 days a year use of one of their vans. One of the days can include a driver for up to 4 hours.

The board approved that the Church property become a smoke free environment. If Church Council approves this action, Buffy will work at obtaining signage and Paul will lead the project to install the signs.

The board approved the acquisition of a rug cleaner for the men's crew's use. Buffy will find the best deal on the desired rug cleaner.



Have you ever wondered why we decorate with poinsettias at Christmas? It is said that the poinsettia has a Christian significance. One tale suggests that it was first brought to this country from Mexico by Dr. Joel Poinsett. It was in 1825 that Poinsett, then U.S. Minister to Mexico, became familiar with this beautiful crimson plant that covers the hillsides in Mexico.

After four years, he returned to his Charleston, S.C., home and brought with him some of the plants and a Mexican legend. They called it the "flower of the holy night," and associated it with a story about a little girl who wept on her way to church on Christmas Eve because she had no gift

to bring. As she knelt on the ground to pray, she saw this lovely plant and gladly took its red beauty into the church as her Christmas gift to the Christ child.



Each year the Congregational Care Committee coordinates the delivery of those lovely Christmas Poinsettias to our members who are shut-in or unable to come to church during the Christmas season. Approximately 25 flowers are delivered each year. If you would like to assist in this effort, please sign up at the Congregational Care table in Criswell Hall during coffee hour or fill out the form included in your Sunday Bulletin.
