THE ART OF EXTRAVAGANT WELCOME

Ideas on Outreach and Hospitality From Church Consultant Mary Scifres "Come with me by yourselves to a quiet place and get some rest."

(Mark 6:31b NIV)

IDEA FOR THE WEEK: Give one another permission to leave for vacation.

Summer brings many people opportunities to travel, rest, renew, and vacation. This is a gift we can celebrate! Sometimes, church members and leaders feel guilty about going on vacation and missing church. Even Jesus led the disciples away for rest and renewal, away from the crowds and "regular churchgoers." Encourage one another to take time for rest and renewal, even if it means a sabbath from church or vacation weeks far away. When you are traveling and visit other churches, bring stories and anecdotes back to share with friends, so that you stay connected as you come and go through the summer months.

Be kind about absences. Assume the best when people are absent, and prayer for their safe return. When I returned home from college one summer Sunday, my pastor said, "It's great to see you! But where have your parents been?" I felt so guilty that my parents had missed church. Although I'm sure my pastor didn't mean to sound chastising, it felt that way. Be gentle with one another about absences. Assume that people who are absent are absent for good reasons. Of course, we should check in with one another when someone is missing, but doing so with careful words and an accepting spirit makes a big difference. Use words and phrases that open the door to conversation: "We missed you last week. I hope you were doing something fun or restful." Or, "I missed church a lot earlier this summer, but haven't seen you since I returned. Is anything wrong, or are we just ships crossing in the night?" One can never go wrong with a warm greeting when you are reunited with friends at church: "It's great to see you! I hope your summer is going well."

Extending extravagant welcome isn't just for new guests; it's a gift we give to one another every time we are reunited in worship and fellowship.

"For everything there is a season." (Ecclesiastes 3:1 paraphrased)



FALL UMM MEETING SCHEDULED


The Fall meeting for the UMM has been scheduled for Saturday, September 10th at 9:30 a.m., (Coco's Restaurant).

Western Jurisdiction Elects Karen Oliveto Bishop

The Rev. Dr. Karen P. Oliveto was elected to the episcopacy on the 17th ballot by the Western Jurisdiction has elected: of The United Methodist Church (UMC). • The first

"Today we took a step closer into living into beloved community," said Oliveto.

Since 2008, Oliveto has served as the senior pastor of Glide Memorial UMC in San Francisco, CA. Glide is the Western Jurisdiction's largest membership congregation, and one of the top 100 largest membership congregations in the denomination. Prior to Glide, Oliveto served as the associate dean of academic affairs/director of contextual education at the Pacific School of Religion (PSR) in Berkeley. She has held pastorates at Bethany UMC in San Francisco and Bloomville UMC in Bloomville, New York, as well as a campus ministry position at the Ecumenical House Campus Ministry at San Francisco a State.

During his Episcopal Address on Wednesday, Bishop Warner H. Brown, Jr. of the San Francisco Episcopal Area reminded the body of the Jurisdiction's vision to "be a home for all God's people, gathered around a table of reconciliation and transformation." The jurisdiction is multicultural and inclusive, engaged in the life of its communities with confident, effective, lay and clergy leadership in diverse ministry settings forming disciples who live out the Good News of Jesus as global citizens.

The Western Jurisdiction has traditionally been a place of historic first elections. Delegates to the Western Jurisdictional Conference have consistently advocated for full

inclusion of all in the life of the church. The Jurisdiction has elected:

- The first Asian-American, Wilbur Choy (Chinese-American) in 1972. He served in the Seattle and San Francisco Episcopal Areas before retirement;
- The first African-American bishop in the Western Jurisdiction, Melvin G. Talbert in 1980;
- Bishop Elias Galvan, the first Hispanic ever to serve as president of the Council of Bishops (in 2001);
- The first Japanese-American bishop, Roy Sano in 1984; and,
- The first Latina bishop, Minerva Carcaño, elected in 2004.

Oliveto earned a Ph.D. and a M. Phil. From Drew University, a M.Div. from Pacific School of Religion (PSR), and a BA from Drew University.

She has served as a General Conference delegate in 2004 and 2016, and a Jurisdictional Conference delegate in 2000, 2008, and 2012. Oliveto serves on the General Council on Finance and Administration (GCFA), the Western Jurisdiction Council of Finance and Administration, the General Board of Higher Education and Ministry (GBHEM) as a coach for the Lead Women Pastor Project. 
