

From the Pastor

March 1st begins the Lenten Season Join us on Ash Wednesday at 6:00 p.m.

Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. Lent comes from the Anglo Saxon word *lencten*, which means "spring." The forty days represent the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin his ministry.

Lent is a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of self-examination and reflection. In the early church, Lent was a time to prepare new converts for baptism. Today, Christians focus on their relationship with God, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and give of themselves for others.

Sundays in Lent are not counted in the forty days because each Sunday represents a "mini-Easter" and the reverent spirit of Lent is tempered with joyful anticipation of the Resurrection.

Join us in Worship for the Six Sundays of Lent March 5th, 12th, 19th, 26th and April 2nd & 9th

We begin Lent together with a simple worship service in the sanctuary Ash Wednesday, March 1st at 6:00 p.m. During Lent I will offer a lectionary-based series of sermons, IN THE CROSSFIRE, lifting up pivotal decisions made by Jesus, Nicodemus, Lazarus, the Samaritan Woman, the Blind Man and people around them that gives us a mirror for our own decision-making as disciples of Jesus.

A video-based study THE WAY: Walking in the Footsteps of Jesus will guide us on the path to and through the cross. Encounter the life and ministry of Jesus in a fresh and exciting way as Adam Hamilton explores the earthly ministry of Jesus in a way that helps you hear his teaching and view his actions anew drawing upon insights from history, archaeology, and the geography of the Holy Land. 



Everett Lee Taylor Scholarship applications are available on-line and in the church office in March. The purpose of this scholarship is to help deserving United Methodist students enrolled in accredited universities, college, and technical schools defray the cost of their education.

Only students who are or have been active members of the Arroyo Grande First United Methodist Church may apply. Graduating high school seniors must include letters of recommendation as well as a high school transcript with their completed applications. Returning college students will need a college transcript but are not required to submit letters of recommendation. Students may apply for this scholarship more than once provided they have maintained a minimum 2.5 GPA in their college work.

The completed application with required attachments must be turned in to the church office by May 15th. Scholarship recipients will be introduced to the congregation in early June. Scholarship checks will be given to recipients upon proof of registration in Fall, 2017 college classes.
