One by one candles will be extinguished as we listen to the story of Jesus entering the darkness of betrayal, violence and crucifixion as his life is taken away.





There's a day that's drawing near when this darkness breaks to light And the shadows disappear, and my faith shall be my eyes. Jesus has overcome, and the grave is overwhelmed The victory is won, He is risen from the dead.

And I will rise when He calls my name, no more sorrow, no more pain I will rise on eagles' wings, before my God fall on my knees and rise, I will rise

Truly, the grave is overwhelmed by the Easter miracle. We are not April Fools! We are the disciples of Jesus Christ who follow Him into the future that God has both promised and prepared for us. Thanks be to God.


Sometimes questions are complicated, and answers are difficult to see. How do we discover the truths that give meaning and purpose to life?

The Sanctuary was taking an extraordinarily long time to heat up (nearly 3 hours). We found that the old ducting system under the Church was shot. We looked into sending the heat directly into the Church through the wall separating the Sanctuary and the furnace room. We went out for quotes and received two back. The one from Wighton's was very high at \$9,000. The other from Renco (Steve) was for under \$1,000 if we could cut the holes. We cut the holes (thank you, Bernie!) and the job came in under \$700 and the Sanctuary now heats up in under 1 hour. You may want to notice the three new heating vents near the rear of the Church that create this great efficiency.

The large commercial refrigerator in the kitchen stared running warm again. We had CalCoast come in to repair it. They fixed the leak but found a problem with a coil. The unit is no longer manufactured, and the part would have to be made. They quoted us a cost of nearly \$1,000. We opted to go new. We found Sears had refrigerator-only units marked down from \$800 to \$500 so we ordered two with delivery, and paid extra for a 5 year replacement warranty plan for each. They are now up and running.

Mary Hawkins and others will soon meet with Executive Janitorial for a walk-through on what we need to see gets done in the future.

Since the new gas line does not reach over to the

# ELT SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS ON-LINE

Everett Lee Taylor Scholarship applications will be available on-line (www.worshipweekly.com) and in the church office beginning in March. The purpose of this scholarship is to help deserving United Methodist students enrolled in accredited universities, college, and technical schools defray the cost of their education.

Only students who are or have been active participants in the Arroyo Grande First United Methodist Church may apply. Graduating high school seniors must include letters of recommendation as well as a high school transcript with their completed applications. Returning college students will need a college transcript but are not required to submit letters of recommendation. Students may apply for this scholarship more than once provided they have maintained a minimum 2.5 GPA in their college work.

The completed application with required attachments must be turned in to the church office by May 15<sup>th</sup>. Scholarship recipients will be introduced to the congregation in early June.

# Reflecting Upon Lent

Members and Friends of United Methodist Church, Arroyo Grande:

This letter from the Rev. James Powell, North District Superintendent, came on our church email a week or so ago. I set it aside to include in our Cast-A-Net newsletter during Lent. Thank you—Your editor

Faithful Servants,

The season of Lent is upon us. This is a time to reflect on our limitations, frailties, and sinful/selfish ways. How counter cultural to consider that we are limited humans who make mistakes, and yet, precious in God's sight because of Jesus Christ's redemption.

The Christian Church thought it best to consider our shortcomings before we consider our freedom in the Spirit. Early Christianity asked the people of God to ponder on our mortal state of ashes and emptiness before we consider the fullness of God's resurrection into new life. As Paul emptied himself, and described himself as slave to Jesus Christ in Romans 1:1: "I, Paul, am a devoted slave of Jesus Christ on assignment, authorized as an apostle to proclaim God's words and acts." (Message Bible)

We often say that confession is good for the soul. Getting into the proper position before God is the beginning of new life, healing, and the restoration of wholeness. Out of the ashes comes new life and growth. Pastor Bethany Carpenter has developed a Lenten worship and studies series based on the writings of Rev. Dr. David Bachelor in a doctoral thesis entitled, "Death Shadow; Christianity and Post-traumatic Stress."

Lenten messages and teachings such as these can help provide a path forward for returning war veterans, and returning survivors of our fires and mudslides. We have a long recovery ahead of us. Your day-to-day worship and classes can make a huge impact in the lives for which Jesus died and was resurrected.

From the valleys of shadows and death comes life and hope.
