

Evensong

**A *very special service* in a
*very special location!***

On Sunday, September 13th at 3:30 p.m. there will be a very special service known as an "Evensong service" led by our choir director Julie Walters. An Evensong or evening prayer service is often celebrated in the Anglican Church in the late afternoon or evening. Most of the service is sung. It is roughly the equivalent of [Vespers](#) in the [Roman Catholic Church](#) and the [Lutheran churches](#). Our chancel choir first became aware of the Evensong service during their tour of England, several years ago and wanted to share this experience with the whole congregation.

Consisting of choral music and congregational singing along with prayer, scripture and meditation, this service will prepare us for Charter Sunday one week later. A highlight of this service will be its location. Through the generosity of the current residents, the Harvest Church, we will be able to return to our original starting point – the "Old Methodist Church" located in the Arroyo Grande Village. Since our congregation left that location and moved to the "new" church located at our current address, this building has had several identities but now, once again, it is home to a new house of worship. This will be an experience that you won't want to miss.
