Message from Ms. Maddy:

The Spring Family Survey Results for 2018 are in. 100% of families surveyed felt that their child was well cared for and that their child was happy and enjoyed participating in our program. 94% of families were "Very Satisfied" and 6% were "Satisfied". According to the survey, the top reasons why families chose our program were: our age-appropriate curriculum, location and environments. A few comments provided by families included: "I have seen my child grow academically and emotionally being in this program. I couldn't be happier."; "It's very helpful that your open during the summer and that you offer a Pre-K program."; "We love how caring and nurturing everyone is."; "Very pleased with the program and the care all the staff provide." and "Best program ever!"

The most popular event that families participated in this past year was the Holiday Program, in December. Family involvement is key to our program's success. 85% of the families surveyed helped with classroom activities such as making playdough, cooking, providing snack, or doing laundry.

100% of the families that turned in the survey, participated in Parent/Teacher Conferences. They found the conferences to be informative and learned how their child was growing and developing. To learn more about Ms. Daphne, a Welcome Letter was placed in your family folder. I also put the letter on the information board above the Sign In/Out Area.
