The Spring Family Survey Results for 2019 are in. 100% of families surveyed felt that their child was well cared for and that their child was happy and enjoyed participating in our program. 91% of families were "Very Satisfied" and 8% were "Satisfied". According to the survey, the top reason families chose our program was: our Low Child to Teacher Ratio. A few comments provided by families included: "I am so very happy in my child's first pre-school years. He loves going."; "Great Program. We love it."; "We love AGUMCC. Our daughter has grown so much and we are thankful for such a wonderful school."

The most popular event that families participated in this past year was the Holiday Program, in December. Family involvement is key to our program's success. 63% of the families surveyed helped with classroom activities such as making playdough, cooking, providing snack, or doing laundry. 81% participated in fundraising events, and 55% participated in school socials.

100% of the families that turned in the survey, participated in Parent/Teacher Conferences. They found the conferences to be informative and learned how their child had grown and developed.
