

WEDNESDAY NIGHT BIBLE STUDY

Wednesdays in Criswell Hall at 5:00 PM SEPTEMBER 4 we will begin Stories Jesus Told: How to Read a Parable by Greg Carey.

The six sessions of the study correspond to the six chapters of the book:

SESSION 1 Sep 4—Divine Inefficiencies (Mark 4:1-20)

The Parable of the Sower shows God's message being scattered on good soil and bad alike. Isn't that wasteful? Come to think of it, aren't parables themselves rather inefficient? This opening session introduces us to the concept of parables, including why Jesus used them and how we can approach them.

SESSION 2—Sep 11 Funny Business (Matthew 20:1-16)

The Parable of the Workers In the Vineyard raises curious questions. While Jesus often drew his stories from the daily business of his hearers—fishing, farming, herding, and getting paid—it's seldom "business as usual." The Master Teacher routinely challenges our assumptions.

SESSION 3—Sep 18 Weddings Gone Awry (Matthew 22:1-14; 25:1-13)

The Parables of the Wedding Party and the Bridesmaids are rooted in first-century culture, but each one has its surprises. And just when we think we get it, there's a new twist.

On a Personal Note...

I feel newly excited about this church! I was glad to be here at the get-go, but am even happier to be here now. It was a journey to finally be appointed here, to acquire housing and arrive at your doorstep a little bit late (July 19th) four years ago. My mother had died not long before I came, I had packed an entire household by myself, putting every blessed box together first, and frankly I was exhausted and didn't know it. Sometimes we see things more clearly in retrospect. Moving is arduous. Don't ever underestimate what it takes to move!

After tearing a meniscus while doing a memorial service in our sanctuary two years ago October, having surgery six months to the day later and a life-threatening STROKE (of all things) six months to the day after THAT, I have a different perspective. It's obvious to me NOW that I wasn't feeling good even when I came and that I was unusually tired BEFORE I ever *knew* I had that very treatable cancer. I say all that just to say this!

I am feeling great now, and the better I feel the better it is for this church. Creativity returns when you're feeling good and new possibilities show their faces. In order to get going again, I've had to back off from you all a bit, tune in to what I needed and re-focus. It's paying dividends with energy, renewed happiness and a sense of well-being.

This is a beautiful church filled with talented people and I am glad to be a partner in the Gospel with you. Take a moment to applaud who you are together, what you have created here and the newness that is emerging. Give God the glory, but you take a bow too! You are a great congregation and you are much appreciated.

SESSION 4—Sep 25 Lawyers and Samaritans (Luke 10:25-37)

The Parable of the Good Samaritan is one of the best-known stories in the Bible, but most people get it wrong. This session digs into who these characters are and how this parable answers the question "Who is my neighbor?"

SESSION 5—Oct 2 Losing, Finding, Partying (Luke 15:11-32)

The Parable of the Prodigal Son is probably the next-best-known parable, but this presents challenges too. This session looks at all three main characters in that drama, and at the other two "lost and found" stories contained in Luke 15.

SESSION 6—Oct 9 A Reversal of Fortune (Luke 16:19-31)

Several of Jesus' parables deal with surprising turnabouts. "The Last shall be first," Jesus liked to say. The Rich Man and Lazarus is a great example, extending beyond the death of both characters. This session works to strip away the theological presuppositions that might keep us from reading this story on its own terms.

Come join us in this 6-week study of <u>Stories Jesus Told: How to Read a Parable.</u>

Communication

How do you communicate?
