UNITED METHODIST WOMEN RETREAT

The UMW retreated September 13-14 to learn about our sisters in Christ of 150 years ago and their efforts to organize and mobilize for mission. Imagine the late 1880's. Women did not enjoy the same freedoms we possess. It was a male-dominated world. Female leadership within the church had almost always been subtle, behind the scenes, and accomplished through quietly influencing men who had power. Against all odds, these sisters established a vibrant society.

In 1965, the Methodist Women's magazine quoted a Scarritt faculty member who called Methodist deaconesses "Loving Trouble-Makers." She did not mean that they loved making trouble, but rather that they made trouble because they loved. They loved others enough to raise their voices to speak for those Jesus called "the least of these". This sisterhood realized that if they wanted social change, they must promote social action.

Although not officially recognized as a lay order until the 2016 General Conference, Deaconesses organized in the end of the nineteenth century. Ever since, the ranks have been filled with women engaged in some of the most interesting and significant ministry in United Methodist history.

"The organized unit of the United Methodist Women shall be a community of women whose purpose is to know God and to experience freedom as whole persons through Jesus Christ; to develop a creative, supportive fellowship; and to expand concepts of mission through participation in the global ministries of the church."

Bishop Hagiya has asked all local churches to attend a "Listening Post" event, to hold "House Meetings" to discuss what we personally want to see in the future church as first steps in creating a statement to present at a Church Council meeting, to print prior to Charge Conference and to adopt at our Charge Conference. "Listening Posts" have not been announced. We must proceed to meet the deadline. We invite you to attend a

discussion after worship on either/both Sundays, October 6th & 13th to share your thoughts. Other existing small groups will be invited to do likewise. A writing crew will draft our statement.

The conversation will be held in the pastor's office between first and second service and after second service for those who will participate.

FROM YOUR LAY LEADER

Have you looked at our church Narthex/Lobby lately?

Did you know that the interior design of a church narthex/lobby is the first space in the church building that most people experience? This is especially important for new visitors who are taking in every detail about the church as soon as they arrive. They are making both conscious and subconscious observations about the environment. What kind of impression do you think our church narthex/lobby gives to visitors? Do you think it reflects our image well and conveys a welcome to all?

Our church Trustees have been discussing this and thinking about how we can improve the appearance of our church narthex. A committee consisting of Irene Kliesch, Mary Hawkins, Marjorie Ott, Pastor Mary, and myself was appointed and has been doing some research. Several churches in the area have been visited for ideas including the Nipomo Presbyterian Church, St. John's Lutheran Church, St. Barnabas Episcopal Church, New Life Church, Grace Bible Church and Mountainbrook Church in SLO.

The committee has alsodone some research about the narthex (or lobby area) on the Internet. One thing to be considered is that the narthex (lobby) is the primary place where people congregate to connect with others. So the lobby should be designed to serve as "communication central" for the church. Not only should people be able to get information, but it should be where newcomers can learn what the church is about and, if desired, find further information. Most planners recommend that the lobby should have some kind of visitor desk that can be seen immediately upon entering the lobby or front doors.

Members of the committee have talked with two local designers and three contractors. The contractors made several suggestions for us to consider – the "popcorn" ceiling is dirty and must be either removed or covered up. The wall around the drinking fountain is damaged and must be repaired or the drinking fountain removed and the space covered up. New floor covering is needed. The lighting needs to be updated and made more energy efficient. The whole area needs to be painted. The furniture must be replaced.

The Board of Trustees presented their concerns and suggestions to the Church Council last month and the Council voted to move ahead with the refurbishing. A contractor will now be selected and the work will begin. I hope that everyone will be supportive of this project and tolerant as the work commences.
