Spring is in the air and the children are very aware of the changes in weather, and the new growth of plants. They have observed the strawberries start-

With the school closing, we did not have the chance to transplant flowers and sugar snap peas in to pots, as I had planned. Hopefully we will be able to do this as well as add a few plants to our gardens, once we open again. We will look forward to working on fine motor skills and eye hand coordination, as we water our plants with spray bottles and sprinkler cans.
