I am happy to say that the children are adjusting quite well to class routines and making new friends. The children are practicing spelling their first names using our classroom job chart, plus they are cleaning up after themselves when snack and lunch are finished. They are very proud to show their 'bubble glove' (soap lather) to their peers and teachers when washing hands, and they are learning to share materials while maintaining social distancing. With each day that passes, we see more and more independence!

The children are showing great interest in bugs, insect, and dinosaurs. They are excited to watch the caterpillars and butterflies in the backyard. They also enjoy watching the lizards crawl on the rocks in the garden. Children are enjoying digging in the sand box and burying "treasure" such as dinosaurs, shovels, and other small sand toys. Once bur-

ied, their friends excitedly find the hidden treasures. Outside in the play yards, the children are pretending to be dinosaurs and making the roaring sounds as well as playing hide and seek. They are exploring hand puppets and putting on puppet shows in addition to pulling each other in the wagon. They are also problem solving by thinking of solutions when the wagon gets stuck in the rocks.

November is a month of parent/teacher conferences. This year teachers will be contacting the families via Child Pilot to set a date and time for conferences. We will be sending the class assessment packets home for families to review. Also, we will be working on a variety of art projects like hand-print turkey placemats and collages. In addition we are also working on letter and number recognition plus cutting and tracing. We will be talking a lot about families and being thankful for the things that God has given us. Thanksgiving is a time that we can communicate respect for others and share the traditions from our various cultures.
