Many of our staff are putting in extra hours as we adjust to this new situation. Our income for use of space in our facility for the pre-school and other groups has dropped to zero. This makes us even more dependent on your continued generous gifts to keep our Church and its ministries going through this difficult period. I urge you to continue your regular tithes and offerings. For some this may not be possible due to a loss of income and we understand. I encourage those who can afford it to try to put in a little extra. We have already received one generous special donation to help us out. Checks may be mailed or dropped off at the Church. Jackie Llewellyn and Jamie Foster have set up an electronic giving option through our web site. Please go to our worshipweekly.com website and click on the GIVEnow tab towards the top.

Electronic giving is a convenient, easy way to support our church. By giving electronically, you can give anywhere or anytime from your computer, smartphone or tablet. You can donate to one of our special project funds or set up recurring payments so that your weekly tithe continues, even when you are on vacation. You can also make one-time gifts. Gifts may be through your credit card or transferred directly from your bank account. There is a small fee for this service. You may pay the cost of the fee or it will be deducted from your gift amount.

The Finance Committee agreed to provide an online giving option as we are not able to give in-person each week. We chose Vanco to provide this processing service for us. They have 30 years of experience, good customer service and will fully integrate with our current church management software.

You will also want to check the website regularly for updated information in the life of our Church. Prayer requests may now be submitted through the website.



We have scholarships to award to graduating seniors and current college students! Students may apply for this scholarship more than once provided they have maintained a minimum 2.5 GPA in their college work.

Everett Lee Taylor Scholarship applications are now available on-line (www.worshipweekly.com) and in the church office. The purpose of this scholarship is to help deserving United Methodist students enrolled in accredited universities, community colleges, and technical schools defray the cost of their education.

Only students who are or have been active participants in the Arroyo Grande First United Methodist Church may apply. The completed application with required attachments must be turned in to the church office by May 15th. Scholarship recipients will be introduced to the congregation in early June. Scholarship checks will be sent to recipients upon proof of registration in Fall, 2020 college classes.
