Spring is coming and it's time for renewing our gardens. Children will be very involved in this process, as they cultivate the ground, bring plants to plant, and watch them grow. The gardens are an important part of our learning experience, here at AGUMCC. The children learn to care for and appreciate the wonders of life and the delicate balance of nature. The garden also provides science, at its best, with the budding of foliage, the buzzing of insects, the blooming of flowers, and the harvesting of fruits and vegetables. New plants are always a great addition to our play yards. Please check with your child's teacher to find out if his/her class will have a special planting days. If so your child can bring a <u>non-toxic plant</u>, to plant at school like strawberries, tomatoes, lettuce, herbs, beans, pansies, sunflowers, zinnias, bulb plants, to name a few.

We will have a School Improvement WORK DAY for parents and staff to tend to our gardens. There will be a sign up for volunteers. (See dates below for this event.)

It's Enrollment time!! Current families can register for our next session which starts July 6, 2021. Registration is \$150 per student and is due by March 19th. See me for an additional "Registration Form" if you have a second child on our "Waiting List". Current family member can also register siblings in March. I will contact families, not currently enrolled, and on our "Waiting List", starting April 1. Most of our new families start with us in the Toddler Class. A few families will join us in the Preschool and Pre-K Class as well. We look forward to welcoming new families and current families continue with our program.

It is always good to plan ahead when looking for a quality program. We pride ourselves on having an educated staff who have a love for and commitment to young children. Also, we work hard at creating quality interactive environments, both in the classroom and outside. We follow standards set by the following evaluative and assessment tools: Environmental Rating Scale, Desired Results, Classroom Assessment System, and Ages and Stages.

Effect July 1, 2021, there will be \$1 a day Tuition Increase. The increase will help keep AGUMCC open and manage the rising cost of supplies, utilities, and staffing along with demands brought on by COVID regulations.

March is Parent/Teacher Conference time. Conferences provide a great opportunity for teachers and families to spend about 30 minutes sharing information about your child's growth and development since the fall. It is also a time to review goals and reflect on achievements and set new goals to work towards.
