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The Spring Family Survey Results for 2021 are in. Of all the families who participated, everyone was either very satisfied (83%) or satisfied (17%) with the care they received. One -hundred percent of families felt the staff meets their child's individual needs and that their child is happy and well cared for. They also agreed the program promotes their child's learning and development. The top reasons why families enrolled in our program are 1)Low child-to-teacher ratios, 2)Age-appropriate curriculum, and 3) socialization, The vast majority of families (96%) participated in Parent/Teacher Conferences and they found them to be informative, since they learned how their child has grown and developed. Likewise, the surveyed families felt the staff communicated well (92%) and the most preferred form of communication was through the Child Pilot App, with person-to-person communication coming in second place.
