BIBLE STORY FOR SEPTEMBER

Our Bible Story from the Children's Beginning Bible is in Exodus 20.

It's a story of when Moses went to the mountain to get the 10 Commandments from God. Our moral teaching is: "Be Respectful".

Let us be respectful to one another. There are many ways we can show respect. One is by following rules which can keep us safe. Another way is by using our manners and saying, "Please" and "Thank You." Also, we can be respectful by listening when someone is talking. Then, after we have listened, we can show respect by acknowledging what was said with caring and kind words. Following directions is another way to show respect. For example: Families and teachers can make Playdoh to demonstrate to children how to follow directions. <u>Ingredients</u>: 2 c flour, 1 c salt, 4 tsp Cream of Tarter, 4 tbsp oil, 2 c water with food coloring to desired color. <u>Instructions</u>: Combine all ingredients and cook over low to medium heat stirring constantly until a dough ball is formed and it has a smooth finish. Remove from heat and knead until cool. Store in an air tight container.

Hi TK Families,

August was a very interesting time. We worked on the letters Aa for Allie Alligator, Bb for Bubba Bear, and Cc for Catina Cat, along with our assessments for Family/Teacher conferences. With the many absent children we decided to review the letters Aa, Bb, and Cc 2 weeks in a row, so the children who were absent had the opportunity to learn the materials we had presented. We will also revisit some of the other concepts from August such as weighing items, using a balancing scale, and sorting items by color and size to make sure everyone got an opportunity to explore these areas.

For the month of September we will continue with the letters Dd, Ee, and Ff along with our assessments so that we are ready and prepared for our meetings with you. We will also explore the differences and similarities between squares and rectangles in addition to mixing primary colors to make secondary colors. We will discuss ways to be respectful after we hear the Bible story about Moses and the Ten Commandments, plus we will come up with some of our own classroom rules to follow. We would also like to welcome the new families who have joined us. We look forward to getting to know you just as we have been enjoying getting to know our current families.
