

### MISSION HIGHLIGHTS:

GOD'S STEADFAST LOVE...IN ACTION

As you receive this new issue of the newsletter we will be closing in on the end of this year's Lenten journey. It, along with the whole year, has been a different time than we have experienced in the past. I wanted to give any who want to complete this Lenten journey additional time to support the Sewing Ministry being started in Haiti as I challenged in the last issue. So far at this point, I am aware that we will be helping in the beginning of this ministry with funds to support three students.

If you missed the details last month, I am including some of it as a reminder.

A dream of Enickson, who is the pastor of that small church, is hoping to begin a Sewing Ministry for students who have no funds to be able to further their education at a college or university. The idea is to provide a Sewing Ministry to teach students a skill that can be a marketing tool for them to support themselves as they go forward in life. He is hoping for a way for them to find success for themselves and the community.

They have as a goal of beginning with up to 15 students as the funds are raised to start the program. To raise the funds for a student, according to their estimate it will take \$238 per student.

A class of 15 students would be a total of \$3,570. This is certainly cheaper than it would be to help 15 students to gain a skill here in Arroyo Grande. Costs: Sewing Machine \$150.00

Table \$50.00 Scissors, \$5.00 Metric Ruler \$12.00 Material \$15 Thread \$6.00.



If you are interested in this possibility, let me know and we can help make that happen. Checks can be sent to the church marked Sewing Ministry marked Sewing Ministry.


