
From our Pastor

A Cautionary Concern: Ask Before You Hug!

In the 1980's clergy went through training. Then and there it was about protecting people from potential harassment and pastors from being perceived as crossing the line with parishioners. *"Ask before you hug"* was the summary snippet I remember from that workshop long ago. Now I bring it back to you in a new setting and context:

ASK BEFORE YOU HUG

Vaccinations are here, spirits are lighter, and everyone wants to be well. Let's help each other. Because of my role, many contacts and the situation we are coming through, I choose not to hug on Sunday morning because I choose not to risk passing colds and such along to all your friends, and the most vulnerable in my family and our church family. I want to be able to visit them feeling good and safe about what I bring to them and to you. Pastors frequent places visiting the most vulnerable among us. So, please adopt the practice and *"ask before you hug"*, and honor the *"No"* you might get from many at this time and place in our shared journey. My own sisters waited months to hug their own sons and daughters who live across the country. Hugging 's back, and that's good, but, unless you have no doubt, ask first!
