



#### STATEMENT FROM THE FIVE CITIES CHRISTIAN WOMEN FOOD PANTRY

After 30 years at our current site, the Five Cities Christian Women Food Pantry has been asked to find a new location or risk closing. We need the community's help to find a suitable location in the Grover Beach/Oceano area so that we can continue to serve our neighbors in the 5 Cities area. We would require an indoor location, approximately 1000 square feet, that can house 10 large refrigerators/freezers as well as shelving. We would also need ample parking for our clients that pick up food in the afternoons, Mondays through Fridays.

The Five Cities Christian Women Food Pantry was created in 1973 by a group of community members from 15 different churches and service organizations in the area. In the last 48 years, we've gone from feeding seven families a week to providing free groceries for 600-800 families a month. During COVID, we successfully worked hard to continue providing food during a difficult year.

Our new landlord must be open to allowing us to provide food donated from all religions and groups. In addition, we will continue to welcome volunteers from all backgrounds and religions, without discrimination. Again, we hope to find a landlord who is amenable to both requirements.

Our church is such a friendly and safe place to be. We work hard to keep our events and gatherings just right for you and your health.



#### MISSION HIGHLIGHTS:

The world has been experiencing a variety of major disasters since I last wrote. I want to catch you up on what I have learned about the ministry we have been supporting on the island of La Gonave in Haiti.

By now I am sure you are aware of the earthquake which occurred. This along with the political unrest, gang violence, the pandemic and extreme poverty has left much fear among the people.

Pastor Enickson reports that everyone in the congregation is all right. People are very scared to stay inside because of the earthquake aftershocks, rain and winds. Some of the church families are facing issues like garden devastation and loss of animals as well as structural damage to their property.

When we discussed things about the church, you can see by the picture that a part of the church roof has been damaged. As a result, they have been meeting in the yard under a tree because of the aftershocks. They are waiting to see how the storms go before repairing the roof.



Even in the midst of the disaster the students are still excited about their sewing program. The kitchen program, as he calls it, is not going quite as well because of the need for a better stove which he says they can get for \$350.

Enickson, the pastor, is excited to be sharing this dream of helping the young people learn ways that they can support themselves as they move forward in life. Thanks for being a part of the solution so that their dreams of helping young church members can be realized

What they are doing is their way of doing what we have done through our congregation with our scholarship program for our youth as they have gone on to further their education. Pray with them for the success of these new programs.
