#### TREASURER'S REPORT

Can you believe it? This is the second year in a row we have not had a Stewardship Drive due to COVID, though I have not heard anyone complain that they would like more Stewardship Drives. Despite not holding a Stewardship Drive, regular tithes and offerings this past Fiscal Year were slightly above the previous year. We have a generous and dedicated congregation! Total income was down a bit this past Fiscal Year due to lower holiday offerings and lack of facility use income.

This year I am asking everyone to continue to give at or slightly above their current level. We need to sustain contributions as we are bringing back our wonderful Bell Choir Director Leonard Lutz, hiring a new webmaster, hiring a new sound technician, hiring a part-time publicity director to let the world know of the wonderful things we do at our church and hiring a replacement for Mike Clark, our excellent Praise Team leader, who is retiring.

Unfortunately, contributions have been trailing what we received last Fiscal Year and what is needed. As of the end of September we are \$15K below what is needed and \$18K below last year at this time. We need EVERYONE to continue their regular tithes and offering. Giving can be done during regular worship services, checks mailed to or dropped off at the office, or e-giving through our website WorshipWeekly.com. On-line e-giving can be a one-time contribution or can be set up for weekly or monthly contributions on whatever date you choose. Gifts can be done directly from your bank account or using your VISA, MasterCard, Discover or American Express card. Setting up regular e-giving makes contributing easy and convenient, especially for those that are frequently out of town.








## The United Methodist Men are headed on a field trip and you are invited!




#### UMW Book Club Meets on October 15<sup>th</sup>



The dates for this study are October 26, November 2, 9, and 16.



#### GOD'S STEADFAST LOVE...IN ACTION

It is exciting to know that despite hardship the church in Haiti is continuing to forge ahead with their goal of helping their young people receive the training promised them.

When the Mission Team met, we talked about how this congregation could continue to support this ministry. Because of the history of our congregation, being in mission with others, we are able to do just that. We are in the process of making a gift on your behalf to their congregation so that they can purchase the stove needed for' the cooking class. They are also in need of a month's salary support for two teachers for the cooking and sewing classes themselves. We will be forwarding \$1,000.00. This will cover the stove and two salaries with a little extra for supplies. You will make a difference in the lives of young people and their congregation.

This congregation in Haiti has been worshiping outside under the trees since the earthquake. They are still fearful of the aftershocks and their roof was damaged during the earthquake. I doubt that they know yet how they will be able to repair the roof or where they will find funds to do so.
