What have you done with the stress and strain of it all? Some of us need to add that same antidote to anxiety first thing in the morning—"Give it God and WAKE UP!!!"

As I've tried to wake up and do what's right for the church, others and myself, I went to the internet a time or two looking for additional antidotes. I found a list of ten and went away sad and more stressed because I discovered that I was already doing all those things and I was still anxious! So now I was stressed and DISTRESSED all at once! Nevertheless, it was a good list of antidotes to anxiety. I read:

DITCH CAFFEINE... GET SLEEP... MEDITATE... EAT HEALTHY...
PRACTICE DEEP BREATHING... AROMATHERAPY... DRINK CHAMOMILE TEA

If you're doing all that and more, what else might work for you and the rest of us? Do you have an idea to share? Something that's worked like a charm?

Last Thanksgiving, 36 weeks into lock-down, wondering when we'd be together in-person again I was definitely overworked, wanting to binge on food and all the deep breathing, lavender and prescriptive herb tea just wasn't doing it. Occasional moratoriums on Diet Coke which cut the caffeine down to zero did indeed help, but I'll tell what helped most of all---THANKSGIVING! That's the secret that works for me. I anchor my soul in thanksgiving and in gratitude to God which reboots my mind, my attitude and energy for another day. GIVE THANKS!

TREASURER'S REPORT

As the 2021 tax year comes to a close, I hope that you will remember our Church. If you are so blessed to have appreciated stock or need to make a Required Minimum Distribution from a Traditional IRA there can be significant tax advantages to making a donation directly to the Church, rather than selling stock or making an IRA withdrawal then donating the proceeds to a charity. Donation of appreciated securities directly to the Church can save you capital gains taxes and may create significant tax deductions. Those older than 70 1/2 can transfer up to \$100,000 per year from their Traditional IRA to a qualified charity, such as our Church. A distribution done directly from a Traditional IRA to the Charity is tax free if it follows the rules. Please consult your tax advisor and IRA administrator for details.

We have several major improvements around our campus that require funding. The parking lot has recently been re-sealed and re-striped. Though costly now, this should save us a considerable amount of money in years to come by preserving the parking lot. We are purchasing a new and much needed replacement stove for our kitchen. The old one has worn out. A video projector and screen are being installed in Criswell Hall. This will be similar to the system in the sanctuary. It will allow us to show popular and Christian movies in Criswell - as we serve popcorn and other movie munchies. 
