March is Enrollment time for our 2022-2023 session, which begins July 5, 2022. I will contact families on our "Waiting List" starting April 1, 2022. We look forward to welcoming new families to our program. Most of our new families start with us in the Toddler groups. However, there are usually a few spaces available for new families to join us in the Preschool and TK groups.

A Tuition Increase will take effect on July 5, 2022. It will be \$1 to \$2 a day to provide a cost-of-living increase to our staff.

Also, we work hard at creating quality interactive environments, both in the classroom and outside. We follow standards set by the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC), including using the following evaluative and assessment tools: Environmental Rating Scale; Desired Results; Classroom Assessment System; and Ages and Stages. Thank you to our staff, families, church, and board members, for all your time and dedication in making this a great program.
