Thank you for choosing AGUMCC for your child's care and early childhood education. We feel blessed by all the families that have chosen our program and continue to tell others about our school. Word of mouth is the best advertisement.

Remember to check your child's Messages or Activities on Child Pilot daily so you don't miss any information or pictures of your child having fun at school.

Cupcake, the pony is coming on Wednesday, October 13, and Thursday, October 14, at 9:00 a.m. for the tod-dler group, 9:30 for the Preschool Group, and 10:00 for the TK group. If you have a sibling at home, they are welcome to come and have their picture with Cupcake too. Last year's pictures will be on the table for you to enjoy. There is no obligation to purchase. Every child will get their picture taken, and you can decide whether or not you'd like to purchase them after seeing them. If your child does not attend school on Wednesday or Thursday, you are welcome to come and stay with your child to have his/her picture taken.

- 30-Day Notice Policy. If you need to change your "Child Care Agreement," it is required to give a 30-day written notice.
- The Parking Lot Speed Limit is 5 MPH. This is for everyone's safety.
- Be cell phone-free when dropping off or picking up your child. This is important so that you are available to help your child transition to or from school.
- AGUMCC does not celebrate Halloween. Please save your unique costumes for at-home fun, and do not bring treats to share with others.

Wow, time is sure flying, and it is time for teacher/parent conferences to go over your children's progress so far. We will set a time and date and work through changes if those times don't work out. Ms. Andrea and I look forward to seeing you all soon if we haven't yet met for conferences.

September has been a month of lots of learning and fun in the TK classroom. We have now introduced the letters D, E, and F from our Zoo Phonics and the associated animal that children like because they ask if they can hold or hug it. Along with the letters, children learn the name, sound, and movement and come up with words that begin with the letter we introduce. In addition, we introduce the shapes Sandy Square and Ricky Rectangle, so ask the children what shapes we are learning in class. Moreover, children are really enjoying the different activities in the classroom, such as the sensory bin by making their own apple pies, making a letter with sand by looking at a letter, the farmer's market dramatic area, and matching games with apple cards. Children also came up with two ideas of how they are respectful. We wrote them on green and red apples and hung them on our Zacchaeus Tree. Children also painted their own core of an apple, which we will hang from the ceiling.

In October, we will focus on our Zoo Phonic letters H, I, and J. In addition, our theme for the class will be Pumpkins. We will also introduce sorting/ classification using pumpkins. We will be incorporating triangles in our art. Lastly, our moral teaching will be on Kindness. We will read kindness books during group time and point out when children show kindness towards others. ~Ms. Elvia

The Fall is finally here! We have all been anticipating the upcoming holiday season, starting with this wonderful month of October. Our class is already excited and talking about how their families' homes celebrate Halloween. Unfortunately, AGUMCC does not celebrate secular Halloween, but we still have plenty of fun and excitement to celebrate the Autumn Season.

Our dramatic play area in the classroom has been transformed into our own Preschool Pumpkin patch. We can pretend to farm and harvest pumpkins and sell them in our shop. This is a favorite as children pretend they are at Avila Barn, just like they do at home. We will also focus on pumpkin science this month, including the pumpkin's life cycle. We will ask the class to bring a photo that focuses on the month's color, letter, number, or shape. Your child will then sit in the teacher's spot and talk about the picture they brought. I thank everyone in advance for your help with this fun activity. With your support and assistance, we have seen your children grow leaps and bounds.

I want to extend an extra special Thank you to all our preschool Families. Miss Swati and I greatly enjoyed meeting with you regarding your child's development during conferences. As teachers, it makes our jobs easier when we have such caring families invested in their children's education.

At the end of this month, we will have an October Pajama Party on Wednesday the 26th. We invite children to come in their pajamas for a fun-filled day and lunchtime picnic.
