Message from Ms. Maddy

Thank you to everyone who participated in our "AGUMCC's Community Service Project" and gave their spare change for the Pennies for Turkeys Drive. This is a simple way to help the children understand the need of others. The Five Cities Christian Women's Food Pantry also greatly appreciates your contributions. They will use the money to purchase turkeys for the Christmas Baskets, which will be given to families in our community. This year we collected \$710. Yipee!!

Each family will receive a "Family Heritage Information Sheet" this month. We can also work together to build a home and school relationships. Please complete and return it to your child's teacher. This project will help us learn more about your family and the traditions you may celebrate. If your family has a tradition you would like to share with your child's classmates, please tell your child's teacher or message them through the Child Pilot App. We hope everyone feels connected as we invite you to share your family traditions with us.

The children will be practicing for our Christmas Program from Monday, December 12, to Thursday, December 15^{th,} from 9:00 am to 9:45 am in the church narthex. Our Christmas Program will be Thursday, Dec. 15, at 6:30. Children need to be in their classrooms by 6:15 to prepare for the evening. After the Christmas Program, there will be a Social in Criswell Hall following the children's performance. Please sign up to bring an item to share. We will also need help with set up and clean up.

Friday, Dec. 23, 22, we will be having a school-wide "Pajama Day." This is also a Minimum Day. School closes at noon. In addition, the school will be closed for Christmas Break from December 26 to January 2, 2023, to observe New Year's Day.

The results are in from our Fall 2022 Family Survey. Of all participants, 85.7% were very satisfied with the overall quality of this program. We are so pleased that 100% of the families surveyed felt their child was well cared for and that they are happy and enjoy participating in the program. Also, 100% felt the program promotes their child's learning and development and that the staff meets their child's individual needs. According to the survey, families choose our program for the age-appropriate curriculum, socialization, and location. Parent involvement is key to our school's success. Over 78% said they helped with laundry, 66% donated supplies to the school, and 66% participated in fundraisers. 100% of those surveyed, the most popular way families like to receive information is through Child Pilot. The next best way is in person. (See the attached summary for more details.) Thank you to all families who participated in the survey. Your feedback is constructive in our efforts to improve our program.



Children enjoy being doctors and nurses as they care for animals and people in our dramatic play area. In addition, children worked as a team to create castles, houses, and what they called "jumping houses" by stacking colored lids. Children had fun with the number of turkeys as they practice one-to-one correspondence and number recognition as they pinch the clothespins on the turkey to represent the feathers. On the other hand, during rainy days, children had free choice in class and did some cosmetic yoga to keep them moving, which they enjoyed. Also, the children took a peek through the window, and their faces showed they were amazed by how hard it was raining. Children also discussed what type (flowers, superheroes) of umbrellas they had and when they used them. During art, children created jellyfish.
