April showers bring May flowers! We haven't had rain forever and a day and, though I love flowers, I am focusing on other blessings and miracles this spring. The April/May "lectionary helps" and "prompts", that I use, zero in on just that. There were showers of blessings from God in OT passages during Lent culminating in the Blessing of Resurrection at Easter. Easter Blessings & Miracles continue in postresurrection appearances of Jesus to disciples from the Gospel of John and in exciting episodes from the Book of Acts. These will take us through holidays like Mother's Day, Memorial Day, and Father's Day all the way to Pentecost on June 5<sup>th</sup>. It's a promising Spring.

Last week I uncovered an unexpected blessing that this church gave me 36 years ago through the ministry of the Rev. Everett L. Taylor who was your pastor. I was searching for something and happened across a letter received in 1986. It was on the same church letterhead we use today at this address and phone number with Everett L. Taylor's name at the top.

Since coming here his name has haunted me. From time to time I'd say to myself, "Why is his name so familiar? I don't recall having known of him or having met him." That's right. I didn't know him, and never did meet him, but the contact I HAD had was in the form of a delightful letter he sent to me on the occasion of my ordination as an Elder welcoming me into the Annual Conference. How kind it was for Everett Taylor to take the time to craft that letter in 1986, and what a blessing it was for me to rediscover it with new meaning in 2022!

The letter read, "This isn't official, but it is heartfelt: Welcome to Full Connection in our Annual Conference! When I came into the Conference in 1954, I was warned by unofficial letters of greeting from several ministers, not all of whom I knew. So it is my pleasure to greet you." You read that right, it said WARNED and "warned" was carefully crossed out and he had written "warmed" in its place. (Definitely before automatic spell-checkers, which is also a blessing!) The letter continued "If you are up this way, let me buy you a 'cuppa'. Let me know if I can do you any good. Grace and Peace. Everett L. Taylor."

I thought your heart might be warmed as mine was then and now by this Arroyo Grande hospitality expressed on your behalf.

This is a UMM fundraiser for future church needs.





#### GOD'S STEADFAST LOVE...IN ACTION

Reflection from Julie Wilson, Church and
Community Worker, Executive Director, Open
Arms Community Center, Winston-Salem, N.C.

"These are extraordinary times for children. Crafting gives them the ability to imagine, to create and be children when the world around them is turned upside down. It's difficult for both students and teachers to communicate during a time when children need that touch and facial expressions and laughter they used to share among friends.

So, at Open Arms, we help each other. We build each other up with our reading and writing and math skills; yes, even adults can learn new math! When our schoolwork is done, the children play and they color and they create and they use their God-given talents. Sure, they may not color within the lines, or they may get paint all over the tables while their fingers are all sticky with glue. But the room is filled with laughter and talk and chatter and blocks falling loudly to the floor.

Some may see this chaos and noisy and disruptive, but, after a while, this becomes music to our ears. Not even a mask can stand in the way of what God intended for these little people to be children."

#### OUR MINISTRY CHALLENGE FOR LENT

Our challenges for the Lenten season were "Feed Your Faith" and "Feed the Hungry". At this writing we raised \$591 for Heifer International to provide chickens, garden seeds, and honeybees.



Our second challenge was to provide funds to support needs in Ukraine through UMCOR. We feel great about our congregation's response to this need. We have raised \$3,341.

UMCOR has been responding to needs in Ukraine since the beginning of the war. Grants have been given to a variety of local groups in Ukraine and surrounding countries who have received refugees. Monies given provide food, clothing, and medical supplies.
