With inflation up, and the stock market down, I realize that increased giving may be difficult for some, but I am confident that the generous spirit of our members and friends will continue in support of our Church and its missions.

June 5th is Pentecost, so let's begin this season by pledging to the Spirit, and let the Spirit rise among us and in every corner of our shared ministry. God Bless you and keep you!







MISSION HIGHLIGHTS

GOD'S STEADFAST LOVE...IN ACTION

Reflection from Lester Dornon, Global Missionary from the US serving in Nepal, Tansen Hospital

"Last month I was privileged to visit the New Life Psychiatric Rehab Center for a prayer service for the new building. I met a man there named K. He had been kept chained up by his family and was brought into the hospital with deep wounds on his wrists from being kept in bonds. The bones were visible, and there was so much infection that one of the orthopedic doctors was sure that his hands would need to be amputated.

P.N., who is the force behind this center and also the head of the Pastoral Care/Social Services department at the hospital, didn't want to see this amputation happen. He prayed—and he believed that God could do anything—including the full healing of K. and it happened.

Yes, he has some scars to remind him of what he went through, but he has full use of his hands and he is able to remember that God was the one who healed him.

I continue to be humbled by our Nepali Christian colleagues. Even though they always ask us to speak at gatherings, lead Bible studies or teach them, I am constantly thinking that it should be the other way around. I have so much to learn from them.

UMCOR RESPONSE IN UKRAINE

Donors to the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) are providing food, water, medicine, shelter and transportation to Ukrainians and other refugees

fleeing Russian invaders inside their country and to those seeking refuge in neighboring countries.

UMCOR funds are assisting local community shelters in Zaporizhzhia in Southeastern Ukraine and in and Mukachevo and Uzhhorod in Western Ukraine. The United Methodist Ukraine-Moldova Annual Conference is drawing on UMCOR in its support of the basic human needs of people on the move. Shelters exist in cities including Kyiv, Lviv, Kamyanitsia and Uzhhorod.

Initial UMCOR operational grants are assisting the efforts of United Methodists in Poland, Hungary, Slovakia and Romania to welcome and care for the refugees, many of whom are women and children, leaving Ukraine. In addition, a grant to the Human Rights League in Bratislava is providing emergency legal assistance to refugees in Slovakia, primarily through services at the train stations as they arrive.

The United Methodist Church in Estonia will use an UMCOR grant to refit a camp site to house and provide emergency services to 40 refugees.

As of March 30, an estimated 22,000 refugees from Ukraine had made their way into Estonia.

Two camps related to The United Methodist Church in the Czech Republic are also being equipped with an UMCOR grant to house refuges.

So, my challenge to myself and others who wish to join me, continue to be who you are and be willing to take time to help make a change in the life of others.

WHEN IS THE FIRST DAY OF SUMMER?

Farmers' Almanac tells us that the first day of summer arrives with the solstice on Tuesday, June 21, 2022 at 5:14 a.m. EDT. For those of us in the Northern Hemisphere, Earth is tilting mostly toward the Sun. As seen from Earth, the Sun is directly overhead at noon 23.5 degrees north of the equator, at an imaginary line encircling the globe known as the Tropic of Cancer, named for the constellation Cancer the Crab, its northernmost point. The solstice happens for everyone, everywhere on Earth. The term "solstice" comes from the Latin words sol (sun) and sistere (to stand still). At the solstice, the angle between the Sun's rays and the plane of the Earth's equator (called declination) appears to stand still.

Fun Fact: Be sure to look at your noontime shadow around the time of the solstice. It

will be your shortest noontime shadow of the year!
