At the shelter, rescued residents are given the care and attention they need to recover from abusive situations. All of the animals enjoy healthy food, clean shelter, and lots of room to roam every single day. When appropriate, needy animals are adopted to good homes.





"Joy is what I find when I help at the Mason Dixon food pantry—whether it's loading groceries to give to the clients, stocking shelves or talking to the people we serve. We work for all to know joy, not for a select few. All should have hope. I pray that the small part I play shows that there are people who care about their well-being. I see the joy, when I learn from others that are different from me.

Joy is what I feel, when I see new friends who trust me enough to tell their story. How "Rose" works full time at a local school helping underserved students with their homework and finding their way. She works and still needs help in putting food on her own table. I hear the joy in her voice, as she tells me about some of the people she helps. She is a person that I wouldn't have known if not called to Mason Dixon."
