


FALL BIBLE STUDIES

Our First Study

October 11, 18, 25, Nov. 1, 8, 15 (6 sessions)

It is time again to calendar our Tuesday afternoon Bible Studies. **SO** get out your calendar and write down the dates.

We will begin with exploring the miracles of Jesus in Signs and Wonders with Amy-Jill Levine, Professor of New



Testament studies and Bible study author. In Signs and Wonders: A Beginner's Guide to the Miracles of Jesus, Amy-Jill Levine explores selected miracles of Jesus in historical and theological context.

For each miracle, she discusses not only how past witnesses would have understood the events, but also how today's readers can draw meaning from Jesus' words and actions. Chapter topics include:
1. Giving sight to the blind: Metaphors of understanding (Mark 8, John 9) 2. "Take up your pallet and walk" (the paralyzed man) On the role of caregivers. 3. A bleeding woman and a dead girl. The importance of women's bodies. 4. Walking on water and stilling the storm. Ecological readings of the Gospels. 5. The feeding of the 5,000 (or more) The centrality of bread. 6. The raising of Lazarus. Taking death seriously.


After this first study, we will skip Thanksgiving Week and start the second book in late November.

In each of the Gospels, the story of Jesus is intertwined with that of his cousin John, the one whom the prophets foretold would come to "prepare the way of the Lord." When we hear the message of John the Baptist, it makes us and our world ready to receive Christ.

Chapter topics include:

- 1. A People Prepared for the Lord
- 2. God Is Gracious
- 3. The Fruit of Repentance
- 4. Witnesses Testifying to the Light




UWF BOOK CLUB TO DISCUSS LEAVING TIME



Have you met Brad Bettencourt, our church organist?? If not, you have a treat in store! Brad retired from teaching in "the Valley" in 2016 and decided to move to the Central Coast where his two sisters live. Luckily for us, he decided to visit the Methodist Church in Arroyo Grande and "the rest is history!"

Brad was born in Turlock, California and grew up on a dairy farm in Atwater. While in high school he worked at a flower shop in Turlock and enjoyed it so much that he decided to go to a trade school in Portland to study to become a florist. By the time he was 21 he bought his own flower shop. Flower arranging is something he enjoys very much (as some of us learned when we attended his flower arranging classes last year!). But after 12 years as a shop owner, he decided that he wanted to try something else! So, he went back to college and got his degree in education. From 1988 to 2016 Brad taught Kindergarten, 1st, 3rd, and 5th grades in the town of Livingston, near Atwater. It is obvious when talking with Brad that he loves teaching and children. Besides teaching, he kept busy planning and carrying out summer camps and vacation Bible schools for his Turlock Baptist church. During this time, he also adopted Ramon or "Raymie" as he affectionately calls his son who was three years old at the time of adoption. When Brad decided to move to Arroyo Grande, Raymie also made the move. Raymie is a barber and works at the "Sports Clips" barber shop near California Fresh Market.

As we all know, besides children and teaching, Brad loves to play the organ! He started taking lessons when he was in eighth grade. And played for his church in Atwater until he moved here. When he first visited our church, he noticed that we have a beautiful organ, but no one was playing it on a regular basis. He spoke with Pastor Mary and learned that we were looking for someone to be our church organist, so he volunteered! He says it is a wonderful instrument and he enjoys playing it. (And we enjoy listening to him playing it!)

Even though he has retired, Brad has not slowed down! Most days, he can be found early mornings, at the church, practicing on the organ. Once a month Brad takes a Sunday off and he and Raymie go to Livingston to visit "Mona", Raymie's daughter who lives with her mother and is now 5 years old. Brad proudly tells me that Mona has started kindergarten at the same school that he once taught at! Brad is also very close with his family, and the whole family (including his sister who recently moved to the Azores), "zooms" once or twice a month to keep in touch.

Brad says his philosophy of life is to "See the good in everything!" Stop by the organ and chat with Brad and you will see that attitude reflected in his smile and his music!

Liz is a Deaconess working in the Community Care Fellowship in Nashville, Tennessee.

"Overnight shelters for people experiencing homelessness can be chaotic but happy places. Folks are buoyed by a warm meal and a clean bed with the promise of a safe night. Those nights usually end in the very early morning as they head back into an uncertain world.

For several years, I was often the van driver on this morning trip. My still sleepy passengers were usually quiet and tense as everyone considered the day ahead and their plans for survival.

One spring morning, as we inched our way through traffic, I heard the familiar chords of a favorite song, "Purple Rain" by Prince on the radio and turned it up. It only took a few seconds for those chords to reach the back of the 16-passenger van and a few more for everyone on board to sing along with the first "I only want to see you laughing in the purple rain."

The next seven minutes, we all sang at the top of our lungs in shared joy. There were nodding heads and air guitar solos. God brought us together in an unexpected way, bringing joy and connection into a space where it became holy."
