As a quality childcare provider, our staff participates in the Quality Counts program provided through the San Luis Obispo Child Care Planning Council. However, we do have a 30-day written notice policy that is required for families needing to make changes regarding their childcare needs. There is always movement in childcare, and spaces for children in our program are limited. With this policy in place, when space does open up for another family, AGUMCC has ample time to notify a new family so they can join our program.

Please check to make sure your child has a set of Extra Clothes. Also, this is a good time to evaluate if your child's extra clothes still fit and if the ones in his/her cubby have been there since July.


