Message from Ms. Maddy



Welcome, all to the new beginning year of 2023. In January, the TK class theme was penguins and polar



bears. There were many areas in the classroom with polar bears and penguins. Children have been enjoying the sensory area with winter animals, kinetic sand, gems, trees, and an igloo. Also, children have been challenged

yet persistent with a manipulative penguin activity in which they need to fit pieces of ice cubes and make them all fit into one square.

Moreover, children have been enjoying the large 32 -piece puzzle. Watching them work together as a team to complete the puzzle has been a joy. Also, the dramatic play area has been transformed into a postal office. The children we had sent letters and received packets from their friends and families.
