Ms. Elvia's TK Class

The children very much enjoyed the various fall arts, like painting an apple core, leaf rubbing, and a pumpkin construction tearing to create silly pumpkins, along with other pumpkin-themed activities we did in October. Culminated with the Pajama Day and Fall Party, which they were looking forward to. Thank you to all the families who donated items and time to make the party a big success! Also, thank you for providing pumpkins that we used for many activities. We did a pumpkin investigation, and the children measured how tall their pumpkin was by using unit cubes, counting the lines on their pumpkin, and what size their pumpkin was. In addition, we did a science experiment to see whether a pumpkin can float or sink. Moreover, we talked about the pumpkin life cycle and the parts of a pumpkin, and we watched a video called "Dissect a Pumpkin" by SciShow Kids and learned that a pumpkin is actually a fruit. Lastly, this month's focus was on Kindness, and in our TK class, children showed various acts of kindness and received a 'Kindness Card' every time they showed an act of Kindness.

We will continue our fall activities for November but move our focus from pumpkins to acorns. The sensory bin is now full of acorns, miniature squirrels, and orange, red, and yellow beads. We also have some hungry squirrels in the math area who need to be fed some acorns based on the number they have printed on their tummies. We also have alphabet acorns in the manipulatives area where the children match the uppercase letter with the lowercase letter. We will also spend our time talking about what we are thankful for as we get closer to Thanksgiving, along with the idea of faithfulness when we hear the story of Daniel and how he bravely let the king send him into the lion's den because he had faith that God would protect him. Those are the highlights of the month. We hope you and your family have a safe and happy Thanksgiving and want you to know that we are very grateful for each child ~Ms. Elvia and all the families in our class!

November is here. The children have learned so much in the time they have been at school. They practice caring for their needs, such as cleaning up after themselves after lunch and snacks.

This month, we will work on various art projects like hand printing turkey place mats collage art. The children will continue to practice their cutting skills, learning to recognize numbers and letters. At group time, snack, and lunchtime, children are learning to spell their and other children's names as they pick up their jobs for the classroom job chart.

Children are showing great interest in pumpkins and leaves. They are excited to make pies, cookies, and coffee in the Diner in our dramatic play. They are learning healthy alternatives like salad and diversity through various foods in the dramatic area. They are excited to see lizards crawling on the ledge in the courtyard. Children pretend to be dinosaurs and make roaring sounds as they chase each other. Children make treasure maps to find the buried treasure in the sandbox. They are enjoying building an obstacle course and jumping around it. They are also having fun with easel art and watering the plants in the garden.
