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Thank you to everyone who participated in our "AGUMCC's Community Service Project" and gave their spare change for the Pennies for Turkeys Drive. This is a simple way to help the children understand the needs of others. The Five Cities Christian Women's Food Pantry also greatly appreciates your contributions. They will use the money to purchase turkeys for the Christmas Baskets, which will be given to families in our community. This year, we collected \$904. Yipee !!



Each family will receive a "Family Heritage Information Sheet" this month. We can also work together to build home and school relationships. Please complete and return it to your child's teacher. This project will help us learn more about your family and the traditions you may celebrate. If your family has a tradition you want to share with your child's classmates, please tell your child's teacher or message them through the Child Pilot App. We hope everyone feels connected as we invite you to share your family traditions.

The children will practice for our Christmas Program from Monday, December 12, to Thursday, December 14th from 9:00 am to 9:45 am in the church narthex. Our Christmas Program will be on Thursday, Dec. 14, at 6:00. Children must be in their classrooms by 5:45 pm to prepare for the evening. After the Christmas Program, there will be a Social in Criswell Hall following the children's performance. Please sign up to bring an item to share. We will also need help with set up and clean up.

On Friday, Dec. 22, we will have a school-wide "Pajama Day." This is also a Minimum Day.

School closes at noon. In addition, the school will be closed for Christmas Break from December 25 to January 1, 2023, to observe New Year's Day.

The results are in from our Fall 2023 Family Survey. Of all participants, 81.3% were very satisfied with the overall quality of this program. 94% of the families surveyed felt their child was well cared for, happy, and enjoyed participating in the program. Also, 100% felt the program promotes their child's learning and development and that the staff meets their child's individual needs. According to the survey, families choose our program for the age-appropriate curriculum, socialization, and because of work. Through parent involvement, we build a strong community, which is vital to our school's success. Over 43.7% said they helped with laundry, 50% donated supplies to the school, and 43.7% participated in fundraisers. The most popular way families like to receive information is through Child Pilot. The second-best way was in person. See the attached survey with more and personal comments. Thank you to all families who participated in the survey. Your feedback is constructive in our efforts to improve our program.

Bible Story: "The Good News", from the Beginning Bible, Luke 2:8-20.

"Fruit of the Spirit": Peace.

Verse: Isaiah 26:3

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In November, the children were interested in building with the trains and tracks, as they got so creative building bridges and had awesome conversations about the different places they were going to. Children worked cooperatively when building and sharing the trains with their peers. Moreover, children are having fun with the number of turkeys as they practice one-to-one correspondence and number recognition as they pinch the clothespins on the turkey to represent the feathers. On the other hand, children have also enjoyed the farm play in our block center, in which children have created a farm by building a fence to make a home for the different farm animals and sorting the animals into different groups. Moreover, the children had lots of fun and creatively built a hideout home for the turkey so he wouldn't be eaten on Thanksgiving Day. The children used wooden blocks and popsicle sticks to hide the turkey so it wouldn't be seen. During art, children created jellyfish and decorated them with dabber dots and tissue paper for the tentacles, and we also learned about jellyfish. We also talked about what we're thankful for and what the children were thankful for. The children then made turkeys by coloring a coffee filter and spraying it. They were amazed by how the colors blended. In addition, our Pennies for Turkeys jar was a hit. We sorted and counted the coins. The children also notice it got heavier as they put more coins in it. Lastly, the children made a special turkey handprint placemat and decorated it with fall stickers, which you can share with your family on Thanksgiving Day.
