



Cross and Flame Symbol

Adopted shortly after the merger of The United Methodist church and the Evangelical United Methodist Church, the symbol relates the United Methodist Church to God through Christ (cross) and the Holy Spirit (flame). The flame is a reminder of Pentecost when the witnesses were unified by the power of the Holy Spirit and saw "tongues, as of fire" (Acts 2:3). The two tongues of a single flame may also be understood to represent the Evangelical United Brethren Church and the Methodist Church coming together to form the United Methodist Church.

We appreciate the many gifts of our own Joe Brown as a wordsmith, speaker and carpenter too. His latest creation on our behalf is this very nice wall plaque on which is a beautiful replica of the United Methodist symbol, the cross and flame, complete with a written explanation of its meaning.

Bailey Underwood Achieves Therapy Dog Certification

Alliance for Therapy Dogs (ATD) is an international registry of therapy dogs. ATD provides testing, certification, registration, support, and insurance for members who volunteer with their dogs in animal-assisted activities. ATD dogs are well-mannered, well-behaved dogs that enjoy meeting people. All dogs tested for ATD's certification must be up-to-date on vaccines. ATD teams, such as Bailey, provide therapy in many settings, including but not limited to airports, nursing homes, assisted living facilities, rehab facilities, mental health institutions, schools, hospitals, cancer centers, hospice facilities, college campuses and can also provide therapy in patients' homes. ATD doesn't restrict where its teams visit. Bailey and Sandy Underwood are considered a 'therapy team'. They go where needed. Bailey attended more than 5 classes through Gentle Touch to finally participate in the Therapy Dog Certification. Most visits in the hospital are about a minute.

"If our visit is to someone we know, we stay a bit longer. If you're sad, had a recent loss of your pet, if you are a shut-in or living in assisted living or the in the hospital, give us a call. We will come visit. Bailey says woof!!"

Bishop Dottie Escobedo-Frank sent a thank you letter to FUMCAG and Pastor Mary sharing that our gift provided immediate physical and spiritual support to the church and the community of Lahaina. She stated that every dollar will go toward the rebuilding of the historic part of Maui from these devastating fires. Her heart was warmed by our gift and our giving hearts. She signed with a handwritten "Thank you, First UMC!"



We lost our Mission Team Chair, Judy Atwood, in February, a difficult loss not only for the Mission Team but for Arroyo Grande First United Methodist Church. It's so hard to believe that it's December! It makes me think back to January and the start of the New Year. After months of passing out boxed lunches at the People's Kitchen, the dining area was opened again on January 31st. In February, Rob and I purchased a townhome in my hometown of North Branch, Minnesota. We went to Minnesota to sign papers the end of February, experienced winter once again, and returned to California in March.

We provided casseroles for the People's Kitchen again the 30th of May and then Rob and I left for four months in Minnesota to be with family and friends. Mission Team members made casseroles and served at the People's Kitchen on August 29. Rob and I started the drive back to California on October 1 and made casseroles for 60 to be served on Halloween.

Mission Team new member, Priscilla Alquist, invited Missionary Katherine Parker to speak to members in the McMillan room on November 8. Katherine serves in Nepal and gave an informative presentation on the work of the UMN in Nepal.

The Angel Tree was decorated on November 11 and a Harvest Meal potluck was held on November 12. All were invited. Here we are at Advent once again.

Rob and I have submitted a letter of resignation to Pastor Mary as we feel our absence prevented the Mission Team's progress this year and we will be in Minnesota for more than four months in 2024. The Team needs and deserves a Chair who is available for twelve months. We thank past and present Mission Team members for their support during this year.
