
who brought treats to share.

**Do you need to change your child's contract?** We understand that changes occur for families. However, we do have a 30-day written notice policy that is required for families needing to make changes regarding their childcare needs. There can be movement in childcare and limited spaces for children in our program. With this policy in place, AGUMCC has ample time to notify a new family to join our program when a space opens up for another family.

**Please check to make sure your child has a set of Extra Clothes**. Also, this is a good time to check if your child has extra clothes in their cubby and if the ones in his/her cubby still fit and are appropriate for the weather.

Happy New Year! We welcome 2024 with open arms and high hopes for a successful and fulfilling year. I hope you all had a relaxing break. Last month, it was fun watching our friends sing our Christmas songs together. We hope this new year will bring many more fun-filled activities.

This month, we begin focusing on winter weather and the changing seasons. Although we don't have snow here, we will discuss winter weather in our area, where we get rain and high tides. We have pictures posted on the wall as a visual aid. Children observed the leaves falling from the big tree in the backyard. Children enjoy spending time raking and jumping in the leaves. We will learn about winter plants, animals, and new concepts like hibernation through books and videos.

To start the new year, we will begin a new routine in the class for you and your child. We will practice tracing their name as one of the classroom activities. This will help enforce the skills of identifying their name and learning to trace it by using their fine motor pincer grasp skills and holding markers correctly. Children can build tall ladders and spaceships using connecting blocks and houses for arctic animals using cotton balls and blocks. We will work on fun art projects, like using the children's names to make snowmen and using scissors to make snowflakes and mittens.

As we have started a New Year, please restock extra clothes in your child's cubby since they may have outgrown the ones currently in their cubbies. In addition, please make sure to continue sending your child wearing layers as we are still in our cold months.
