#### What is Tenebrae?

The Service of Tenebrae, or "Shadows," is based on a twelfth- century late night/early morning service and is an extended meditation on the Passion of Christ. Scripture narrating the events of Jesus' last week on earth is read from the gospels interspersed with the extinguishing of candles until the only candle that remains on the altar is the Christ Candle. A bell tolls 33 times to honor the thirty-three years of Jesus' life on Earth. The Christ Candle is then carried out of the sanctuary and worshippers depart in silence. It is a way of remembering Jesus and honoring Jesus' Passion.

This service may be used as (1) a concluding service following Holy Communion on Holy Thursday, or (2) the evening service on Good Friday, particularly as the beginning of a prayer vigil lasting through Saturday.

Our service will be a simple service with the passion narrative from one of the gospels, two or three passion hymns and no homily. The scripture is the message as we honor Jesus' life in worship.

#### Some notes on the history of the First United Methodist Church of Arroyo Grande

This year we celebrate the 140<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the founding of the First United Methodist Church of Arroyo Grande. Our church was officially founded in September 1884 with 24 charter members. Construction of the church was started in 1886 and completed on September 9, 1887. The church and parsonage were built at a cost of about \$3200. A small sum now, a big sum then. The original church building now houses the Harvest Church on Branch Street in the Village. By 1888 membership reached 160 and a new congregation was started in Nipomo. The Nipomo church is now Calvary Chapel. In 1902 an expansion church was built in Oceano. That building is now the Open Door Church. A church was later built in Shell Beach. The Shell Beach church closed in 2006 and is now Pearl Chapel by the Sea. Stained glass windows from the Shell Beach Church are now in the transepts of our church.

About 1890 Camp Arroyo Grande was established just above the Village on land donated to the church by a Methodist real estate developer. The 12-sided Tabernacle was built in 1897 and is still the center of camp activities. About 1912 additional acreage was donated by a logging company. In the early years the camp hosted numerous events including prohibition and women's suffrage rallies. Revival meetings could draw up to 2000 people from all over California! Before World War II



families would often spend many weeks in summer enjoying the camp. In more recent times the camp hosted art shows, educational symposiums, Camp Fire and other youth summer camps as well as corporate and church retreats. The camp eventually became property of the Annual Conference. In 2017 the California-Pacific Annual conference sold the camp to the Five Cities Community Service Foundation, much to the relief of the community who did not want it sold to a real estate developer.



It continues to serve the area as a place for retreats and summer camps.

In 1960 our Church moved from the Village to its present location. Initially the new campus consisted of only what is now Criswell Hall and

wing of the education building that is now the Children's Center. The two-story education building was added in 1962. In 1966 the Trustees authorized the construction of our present sanctuary, which was dedicated June 5, 1968. In 2000 the bell tower was added. It houses the bell from the original church in the village (more about the bell in a future article). In 2005 the Children's Center opened, creating a new and needed ministry of our church to the community.

# Students Encouraged to Apply for 2024-25 ELT Scholarships

Everett Lee Taylor Scholarship applications will be available on-line (www.worshipweekly.com) and in the church office beginning in March. The purpose of this scholarship is to help support deserving United Methodist students who will be enrolled in accredited universities, colleges, or technical schools during the 2024-2025 school year.

Only students who are or have been active participants in the Arroyo Grande First United Methodist Church may apply. Graduating high school seniors must include letters of recommendation as well as a high school transcript with their completed applications. Returning college students will need to provide a college transcript but are not required to submit letters of recommendation. Students may apply for this scholarship more than once as long as they have maintained a minimum 2.5 GPA in their college work and will be enrolled as full-time students.

The completed application with required attachments must be turned in to the church office by May 15<sup>th</sup>. Everett Lee Taylor Scholarship recipients will be announced in early June. Scholarship checks will be given to recipients upon proof of registration in Fall, 2024 college classes.

UMCOR: Embodying Compassion: Being God's Light.

UMCOR, established by our church in 1940, is the United Methodist Committee on Relief. UMCOR Sunday celebration is March 10 this year. This special offering is collected on the fourth Sunday in Lent and provides major support for immediate assistance in the wake of natural and human-caused disasters and helps support ongoing ministries of food, shelter, health and peace. UMCOR provides hope for communities and individuals whose lives have been upset by war, storms or other crises. This ministry is achieved exclusively through your generosity. Last year, your generosity delivered \$1.5 million for direct ministry to persons in need.

In February 2023, a 7.8 magnitude earthquake struck southern Turkey. UMCOR, the United Methodist Committee on Relief, worked with a trusted partner in Turkey to respond. Because many displaced people still live in tents where open flames of candles or kerosene lanterns are dangerous, solar lanterns were distributed, thanks in part to gifts from United Methodists.

We are embodying compassion and being God's light through UMCOR.

In John 3:21, Jesus says to Nicodemus, "Those who do what is true come to the light, so that it may be clearly seen that their deeds have been done in God." This conversation opens up the expansiveness of God, who so loves the whole world and who sent Jesus to lead us on a path to saving grace. Nicodemus later stands up for Jesus when the Pharisees want Jesus arrested and in John 19, he brings a hundred pounds of myrrh and aloe with which to wrap Jesus' body. He embodies compassion. He is God's light.


UMCOR is like a beacon of God's light in some of the bleakest moments of people's lives. When disaster strikes, when families lose their homes, when lives are turned upside down, UMCOR is there, just as Jesus calls us to be.

In Ukraine, for example, fighting forced Tatiana and her seven-year-old daughter to flee their home. Eventually, Tatiana was connected with an UMCOR-IOCC supported Eleos-Ukraine shelter in the Chernivtsi region in the eastern Carpathians. "Everything was different from the hotel," says Tatiana. "Good infrastructure, a clean room and staff who always listen to you and try to solve your problems." After receiving medical checkups and legal consultation, the pair qualified for state social assistance. Tatiana found a job and her daughter was placed in a nearby school. "Lots of people we don't know care about us and want to help," says Tatiana.

We embody compassion and God's light through UMCOR. "Those who do what is true come to the light, so that it may be clearly seen that their deeds have been done in God."

UMCOR is a living example of the light of God's love in action. When we support UMCOR, we become part of something much larger than ourselves, and we shine that light even brighter. Through UMCOR, we bring people from the despair of Good Friday into the brilliant reality of Easter.
