Some notes on the history of the First United Methodist Church of Arroyo Grande by Joel Anderson

As we celebrate our 140th anniversary I thought it might be fun to explore a few of the items that were brought from our old church in the Village of Arroyo Grande when we moved to the present location in 1960. They are still here!

The brass cross on the altar has been the focus of worship in our church for a very long time. It was the altar cross when our church was in the Village of Arroyo Grande. The "IHS" on the cross is a common Christogram, derived from the first three letters of the Greek name for Jesus: iota-eta-sigma.



Behind the altar at the old church was the copy of the picture *Christ in Gethsemane* that is now in the McMillen Room. It was presented to the church by the Japanese Community on Mother's Day, May 6, 1936. For many years the church had a close connection to the local Japanese community. The picture and connection to the Japanese community have faded over the many years. The original painting was done by German painter

Heinrich Hofmann in 1886. It is one of the most widely reproduced paintings in the world and is still available on-line today! The original is on display at Riverside Church in New York.





The altar cross and picture of Jesus can be seen in this picture of the wedding of James Dickens and Sally Dixon on Sept 5, 1954 in the old church



This old stand that is sometimes used for Holy Communion or holding flowers also came from the old church in the village. It is battered and ugly from many years of use, and was almost tossed out until Lorie Ford pointed out its historic significance.

On the parking lot side of the education wing is the cross that once sat atop of our church in the village. The odd holes in the cross indicate that at one time it probably held either some sort of decoration or electric lights, both of which were popular before World War II.

Our bell tower houses the bell that was used by our church in the village. The bell originally came from the Cienega School in Oceano. In January 1920 the Arroyo Grande School District



(now Lucia Mar) faced a sudden influx of children, but had insufficient classroom space. The school district traded the bell for use of a room at the Methodist Church. The church was delighted to receive the bell as it had no bell for its bell tower, and

The church was delighted to receive the bell as it had no bell for its bell tower, and the school district acquired a badly needed classroom. The bell sat in the open for many years after being moved from the old church. The new bell tower was built and dedicated Sunday February 6, 2000.

SCAM ALERTS

More Scams

Scammers are creating imposter Facebook pages and using Facebook Messenger to send out Friend Requests. It happened to me. Someone created an imposter Facebook page using my name and my Facebook picture. They then used Messenger to send out Friend requests. A member of our church texted me and two of my customers emailed me asking about it. I assured them it was not me.

A while back I even got a Facebook Friend Request from my dead father. Since I doubt Facebook exists in heaven (though I would not be surprised if it existed in that other place) I ignored it. If you get suspicious Facebook Friend requests it never hurts to check through other channels. I am not sure what the imposter is trying to accomplish, but I don't think it is for the good of humanity.

Another scam is the wrong number text. Malicious individuals send innocent texts addressed to someone else about a party, medical appointment or business meeting. Once you've texted the person back with a message like "Sorry, wrong number," the scammer tries to pull you into a friendly conversation. They prey on your friendliness and slowly but surely lure you into some sort of scam. If you get a such a text do not reply, just delete it.

News from the Mission Team

New Organization to Receive our Donations of Children's Clothing

Your Mission Team has been hard at work as 2024 unfolds, renewing continuing projects and searching out new ways to serve our community and the world. Imagine the surprise we felt when we contacted the Nome Community UMC in Nome, Alaska and discovered that the layette ministry we have supported for many years had been disbanded! Unfortunately, the lady who had headed that program and distributed our donated hand-knit baby blankets, hats, booties and other layette clothing had left the program, which then closed its operation.

Our own Jan Treat reached out to her contacts at Social Services and helped us connect to a wonderful local organization, Children's Resource Network of the Central Coast. It is a very successful 501C3 organization that provides new and gently used resources such as clothing, shoes, blankets, backpacks school supplies and more to help meet the personal basic needs of socioeconomically compromised children in our area and throughout California.

Drop off bins located at local schools collect donations which are picked up by volunteers and sorted for local distribution. Do check out their website; impressive!

We recently shared our information about the changes in Nome and our discovery of the Children's Resource Network of the Central Coast with our church's Sew & Sews group. They were very happy that such a wonderful local organization had been found to take their hand-made donations. In turn, your Mission Team presented this new organization to Church Council in February and it was accepted in place of the Nome, Alaska project.

Donations of infant and children's clothing, birth through high school, will be ongoing and will be collected in a basket in Criswell Hall next to the Mission bulletin board. What a blessing to our needy local children!


