

Plans Firmed Up For The 125TH ANNIVERSARY DINNER 19 SEPTEMBER 2009



"Extraordinary Service" was Extra-ordinary by Val McClure

When the CAST-A-NET announced an "Extraordinary Church Service" last month it had no idea that the 125th Anniversary Event would turn out to be one of the highlights of our anniversary year.

One hundred and fifty of our members and friends enjoyed a chilly but outstanding presentation of music, gospel and theater set in the 110 year old Tabernacle. Some 30 volunteers worked Saturday and Sunday to prepare the site for the presentation and turned the old building into a "theater in the round" The Methodist Men moved the camp piano from the Dining Hall to the Tabernacle on Saturday, and under the skilled hands of Sean Lehman, the old building reverberated with some of John and Charles Wesley's great old hymns. The Chancel Choir sang an outstanding rendition of "God So Loved the World" under the direction of Julie Walters.

Pastor Burgeson led the congregation in parts of the worship service and when it came time for the sermon turned the program over to Roger Nelson, world famous actor, who for 40 riveting minutes held the audience spellbound as he told of the life of John Wesley and his journey to find the Lord. His presentation was highlighted by a fine stage set furnished by Hilary Henderson. Mike Herber helped to furnish the spotlight and ran the lighting during the performance and constructed the stage background. Our thanks to Morrie Gregory for hauling 75 hymnals to and from the program.

Many of the choir and congregation were in costumes of the 1800. At the end of the service 125th Celebration Chairman Larry (the pig-man) Wiemers and his side-kick Virginia Mothes announced the winners of the costume contest who were; Patty Melsheimer, Rose Ann Steiner, Betty Johnson and honorary mention, B.G. Perriguey.

At the end of awards the congregation was directed to the camp's dining hall, next door, to eat an excellent box lunch prepared by the JJ Grocery Store Deli.

Many of the congregation used the bus service provided to and from camp and used the "Tabernacle Transport" golf cart service run by Chuck Perriguey to help members get up to the Tabernacle level. A great deal of help was given to the preparations by Camp Manager Steve Tallant and his staff. Val McClure, a member of the 125th Committee was chairman for the event.

History of the Tabernacle building is fascinating. The 12 sided structure was completed on July 17th, 1897 from plans believed to be drawn up by Pastor W.D. Bell. The 4200 sq. ft. building is of unique design. The wagon wheel truss and joint mechanism holds the inner roof, the center post (the hub of the wheel) extends through the roof some 20 feet and acts as an outside flagpole. In the new master plans for the camp the Tabernacle will be treated as a "rare jewel" and retained and refurbished as the years go on.
