This month's theme is "How Things Grow and Exploring Farm Life". Spring is coming and it's time for renewing our gardens. Children will be very involved in this process as they cultivate the ground, bring plants to plant, care for them, and watch them grow. We have two areas in the courtyard that we will be reviving with new flowers. We will also be planting a new crop of vegetables in the backyard garden. The gardens are an important part of our learning experience here at AGUMCC. The children will learn to care for and appreciate the wonder of life and the delicate balance of nature. The garden also provides science at its best with the budding of foliage, the buzzing of insects, and the blossoming of flowers.

."Love and Logic" is back!!!! This five week course is for parents and caregivers. Love and Logic teaches positive guidance techniques that include offering choices, setting limits, and logical consequences. <u>www.lovelogic.com</u>. Love and Logic will be in Criswell Hall. It is open to the community. This course will be held every Tuesday in March, 6:00- 8:00 PM. Registration is \$50 per person or \$95 per couple. Childcare will be available for \$5 per child.
