Our Pre-K program follows the Pre-K Guidelines set by the Department of Education which is designed to help children to successfully transition in to Kindergarten.. It is always good to plan ahead when looking for a quality program. We pride ourselves on having an educated staff that have a love for and commitment to young children. Also, we work hard on creating an environment that stands for quality. Thank you to the staff, the families, the church and the board members, for all their time and dedication in making this a great program.
