This month's theme is "How Things Grow and Exploring Farm Life". Spring is coming and it's time for renewing our gardens. Children will be very involved in this process as they cultivate the ground, bring plants to plant, care for them, and watch them grow. We are encouraged in the book of Philippians to "Let your gentleness be known to all men" (Phil. 4:5)
