The Young '3's made full use of the farm animal representations they discovered in the classroom last month. Find-

ing animal puzzles, puppets, books and play figures, they role played, practiced animal sounds and lead their own "Song and Story Times". We talked about how vegetables and fruits grow and sampled a variety of both, in different forms (raw, cooked, squeezed etc.) We also read stories about how plants grow and did our best at gardening, planting seeds and plants. They enjoyed planting them, and especially loved watering them with spray bottles and sprinkler cans. We look forward to watching them grow as we continue to care for them. Now we move into our celebration of new life, as flowers bloom and fruits emerge. This is also an enjoyable time to explore the smallest of God's creatures (AKA bugs and insects) We will explore a variety of critters, some with six legs or some with eight or more.
