Seeing God's Presence in a Week of Tragedy

From shock, fear and anger to mourning, emotions have run the gamut this week as U.S. conferences have dealt with tragedies of many scales.

Throughout the challenges, United Methodists across the connection have told us how they saw God at work even in the most trying moments.

Boston Area Bishop Sudarshana Devadhar of the New England Annual (regional) Conference, said in a letter to the conference after the Boston Marathon bombings that the "outpouring of love and support from friends and colleagues in our United Methodist connection has been overwhelming and wonderful."

As the events in Boston continued to hold the city in their grip at week's end, he offered a prayer for all. "Let us continue to be in deep prayer for God's grace, peace, justice and love to prevail, everywhere in our neighborhoods, towns and villages, cities, nations and the world," he said. Bishop Mike Lowry of the Central Texas Conference, which includes the town of West, noted in a blog: "Collectively this has been a hard week. News of the tragic terrorist bombing at the Boston Marathon was joined (on April 17) by the massive explosion here at home in West, Texas. While Boston may be distant, we still reach out instinctively with our prayer and our care. The town of West is in the heart of our conference. This tragedy is close to home and touches our lives much more intimately. Here, too, we reach out with the love and care of the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ."

The Rev. Lisa Caine, pastor of Oconee Street United Methodist Church in Athens, Ga., reflected on the loss of the church's building in a fire this week. "The building may be gone, but our ministry and mission are alive and well, and we go forward trusting in God's goodness and the future that awaits us," she wrote. "We are assured by the words of Isaiah 41:10, 'Do not fear, for I am with you; do not be afraid, for I am your God. I will strengthen you; I will help

you; I will uphold you with my victorious right hand." At an interfaith service Thursday in Boston, President Barack Obama said, "Scripture tells us to 'run with endurance the race that's set before us" and noted that, "We will all be with you as you learn to stand and walk and, yes, run again. Of that I have no doubt. You will run again. You will run again!"

Bishop Gary Mueller of the Arkansas Conference wrote Thursday on Facebook:

"It's been a week of tragedies. Some — like the Boston Marathon bombing — have been intentional in order to bring death, chaos and fear. Others — like the explosion of the fertilizer plant in West, Texas — may have been caused by human error, but people would have done anything to stop it if only they had known.

"Still others — like the storms in Oklahoma last evening — are simply and sadly the results of humanity being in the path of nature. And, then, there are the countless daily personal tragedies — like the death of children from starvation, sexual abuse, addiction, the breakup of families and terrible illnesses — that never make the news.

"When any tragedy strikes, you probably ask, 'God, where are you in all of this?' Although some people may argue that God is responsible because God allows it to happen, God's not responsible for any tragedy. God's not punishing sinful people. God's not concocting some large-scale teachable moment. God's not instigating suffering to bring about some greater good.

"But just because God's not responsible does not mean that God is not present. Because God is. Fully present. Personally present. Actively present. And this God is inviting you to experience God's transforming love in the most unexpected ways as love defeats hate, hope replaces despair, healing occurs in the midst of brokenness and life emerges out of the ashes of death."

FINANCIAL SUMMARY



The Easter offering and generous giving in March erased the deficit we accumulated in January and February. Expenses continue approximately at plan. 


Carl Kliesch Memorial Golf Tournament



1.) GOD'S STEADFAST LOVE..IN ACTION

Peace with Justice Sunday is June 30. Your gifts on this Sunday will change lives in places where the joy of knowing Christ is mixed with the tragedy of violence. In the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Bishop Nkulu Ntanda Ntambo assumed his post as a brutal civil war began in 1996. After nearly eight years of war, he helped to broker a peace settlement at a conference where 250 fighters committed not to fight again. United Methodists in the Democratic Republic of the Congo — 2.3 million strong — received two Peace with Justice grants from the General Board of Church and Society to respond to the 2011 post-election violence and to teach people to share Jesus' love. The special offering benefits peace-related ministries in annual conferences and through the Board of Church and Society.

Bishop Rueben Job has written a new book titled, *Three Simple Rules: A Wesleyan Way of Living*. This is a little book; only 4" by 6" and 64 pages long with an additional 12 pages of



prayer guides and a song. It doesn't take long to read, but it would take you a lifetime to live by the rules. It is a book to generate much thought and discussion. An adult class at my church has already spent several weeks in discussion, and they're only to the second rule.

Job bases his book on John Wesley's General Rules. He uses a shorthand version: Do no harm. Do good. Stay in love with God. Though they sound simple, making the life decisions to carry out these rules is not easy. Is the car I am driving causing harm to the environment? Am I doing enough good? Am I really willing to commit my life to these principles? Do I have to do this in order to be a "good" Christian? Am I really willing to give up being in control in order to follow these rules?

The class has discussed forgiveness, self-defense, and trusting in God. We sing that we will follow Jesus, but are we really committed to loving God and loving neighbor every day in every way?

Members of this class have to struggle with their own level of commitment. If they were members of a Covenant Discipleship group, they would already be doing that and would have help and support for discipleship.

This book makes a wonderful companion piece to Covenant Discipleship. I recommend it to every Sprouts leader. Use it to strengthen your own spiritual life. Use it as background and guide to teaching the foundations of Sprouts to your kids. Help them think about the ways that we do harm every day -- gossip, cheating on homework or tests, bullying, name calling, littering, wasting energy -- the list goes on.

Are they willing to give up these and other harmful ways? What are the "simple" ways Sprouts can do good? What do they need to include in their acts of kindness and justice?

We "stay in love with God" through acts of devotion and worship. Again, easy to say; but how faithful are we to these spiritual disciplines? You could use the book and Bishop Job's guides to daily prayer to help your kids create their own one-line daily prayers.

As an adult leader, you can be a model and example here. Testify to the impact of spiritual disciplines in your own life. What difference does attending worship and daily Bible study make in your life? How does it help you do no harm and do good? How does it help you stay in love with God?

This book could be a launching point into forming a Covenant Discipleship group for children, youth, or adults. I recommend you take an hour or two and read *Three Simple Rules: A Wesleyan Way of Living*.


