



GOOD GRIEF by Granger E. Westberg


Many people experience grief as the result of loss. This book describes what happens to us whenever we lose someone or something important.

Granger E. Westberg has held a joint professorship in medicine and religion at the University of Chicago and a professorship in preventive medicine at the University of Illinois College of Medicine. He is considered a pioneer in the interrelationship of religion and medicine and in holistic health care.

"Practice resurrection.... faith communities often struggle to practice resurrection in clear and compelling ways." says Eileen R. Campbell-Reed, author of the meditation for the week of April 6-12 in the book of daily devotions, "Disciplines". She goes on to say, "Jesus commends to his disciples the kind of believing that leads to life...Belief in Jesus is participation in an embodied, practiced, incarnate knowing." She suggests we reach beyond belief and "practice resurrection." "Hold a child's hand. Listen to your neighbor. Look into the eyes of the man selling papers on the street corner. Ask yourself: This Easter season, how shall I practice resurrection?"

In Acts 4:32-35 Luke describes the Jerusalem congregations of believers that became "united as one – one heart, one mind! They didn't even claim ownership of their own possessions.... They shared everything...and so it turned out that not a person among them was needy."

Ms. Campbell-Reed goes on to ask, "What might happen if, in the name of Jesus, communities of faith, like the Jerusalem church, took seriously a call to resurrect generosity, life together, and living with 'one heart and soul?"

The Congregational Care Committee invites you to join us in "practicing resurrection" by welcoming a visitor to our Sunday morning worship, visiting a member who is not able to attend services, preparing a meal for someone, calling someone who you have not seen in services for several weeks or in other ways demonstrating that ours is a welcoming, caring congregation.

GOD'S STEADFAST LOVE..IN ACTION

1. MEET HELEN SHEPHERD, COVENANT MISSIONARY Helen is a missionary with the General Board of Missions serving in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia since 2002. Previously she served in Seoul, Korea. Her move was at a request for her to establish a United Methodist mission presence in Mongolia, with a major focus on starting the hospice movement. Her main function as a nurse is directing the Grace Hospice home -care program and building relationships. Currently she is focusing on improvement of the quality of care and the depth of faith of the staff working in hospice. Leadership development is also a main concern for future management of the program. On Sunday morning, she spends time teaching preschoolers. She also leads a weekly Bible study in English for young women, and works with two senior citizen groups that meet at the two mission centers in Ulaanbaatar. She feels that teaching children while working with the elderly and dying is important to maintain a healthy balance in her life. "Serving in Mongolia continues to be an exciting, challenging assignment fostering relationships and allowing for relationships and evangelism to be possible through providing healthcare." She gives thanks to God for providing these experiences. If you don't know where Mongolia is located, look at the map in Criswell Hall.

2. REV. EHRHARDT LANG MISSION FUND

We have received some additional funds for the Rev. Ehrhardt Lang Mission Fund. If you desire to add to this fund to help us support special mission projects, and recognize Rev. Lang, simply mark your gift for this fund and we will be glad to receive it for use of mission projects.

3. 2015 MISSION PROJECTS The mission team discussed mission projects for 2015 when we met in January. We didn't get to meet in March as planned, so haven't selected projects related to our Covenant Missionary or other missionaries yet. Hopefully we will begin with sharing a story from one of their projects dealing with Hunger and Poverty and Health Care soon. It will be interesting to learn about what the ministry in their parts of the world is doing about these areas of need
