

A Message from our New Pastor

Aloha! I love Hawaii, like my predecessor David Burgeson. Though I haven't been there in a long time, I made fourteen trips in a decade while my sister was a twenty-year resident of Kailua on Oahu. For me it was an inexpensive get-away with a free hotel and kitchen at my sister's place. Who could ask for more?

I'm writing this quickly as I make a last commute to Ventura to make sure all is ready to be received by the movers on August 3rd. They will bring my possessions to 632 S. 14th Street in Grover Beach the next day, August 4th. Home at last!

I come to you from the First United Methodist Church of Ventura, where I served as Senior Pastor for six years. During that time I worked to heal a rocky transition in pastoral leadership, put in place a strong staff constellation with a couple younger "players," brought room rental "rates" into a 2015 reality, encouraged and implemented efforts to bring a 75K deficit budget to place where we began 2015 "nearly" balanced from stewardship giving without overdependence on vanishing reserves. We worked with a consultant who assessed our worship and created a Worship Design Team that made beginning efforts to shape traditional worship to be more accessible to a variety of worshippers, and put in place a Vision statement and goals to coordinate and solidify our work together. Together we updated our Safe Sanctuary policy, brought job descriptions and staff evaluations and paperwork up to date, and did the important work of the Lay Leadership Committee to strengthen the church and its effectiveness. Every church is different and with you I will discover the important tasks we need to tackle here.

Enough of that! Prior to serving Ventura, I served a fulfilling interim year for the Tustin Aldersgate Church while living in Irvine. I have also served Whittier First UMC, Reseda First, and Temple City UMC as pastor-in-charge, and right out of seminary did two associate ministry appointments at San

Gabriel First and Lancaster UMC. The challenges of itinerating in our congregations haven't come from being a woman in ministry, but rather from being single in ministry. It's a hard row to hoe moving through the changes "solo."

Originally, I came from Grand Rapids, Michigan when a move brought my family of origin to San Diego where I was a member of St. Mark's United Methodist Church. In San Diego I attended San Diego State earning a B.A. in Psychology while completing requirements to enter Physical Therapy School. Plans were interrupted at the death of my father in 1974 and instead I completed an M.A. in Vocational Rehabilitation Counseling at Fresno State, an internship at Devereux School in Santa Barbara before entering the US-2 mission program and serving in campus ministry at the Wesley Foundation in Kalamazoo, Michigan. I was trying to quell longings to be in ministry. It didn't work!

After the campus ministry experience, I entered Southern California School of Theology at Claremont and completed the M.Div. in 1984 after being ordained a Deacon in 1983 and received Elders Orders in 1986. During seminary I enjoyed Clinical Pastoral Education at St. Joseph Hospital in Tacoma, Washington where I served as a chaplain and was the Youth Director at Granada Park UMC in Alhambra.

The years in ministry have been rich and rewarding, and I love the people of our United Methodist congregations. The rigorous hours ministry requires leave little time for private pursuits, but I enjoy reading, swimming, yoga, time with siblings, nieces, nephews and the "next generation" that has arrived in full force in our family, boasting 15 great nieces and nephews. I enjoy music, worship and would love to have time to do a little writing, and to remember in writing my mother who passed away on January 27th this year.

It's good to be with you. Let's get acquainted quickly and have a good time doing it! It is my joy to be the pastor of First United Methodist Church of Arroyo Grande.



To Be United Methodist: What is "itinerancy"?

When people new to United Methodism hear that a new pastor will soon be serving their congregation, they may ask:

Why don't we get to choose our pastor?

Who makes these decisions?



John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist movement, preached up to 40,000 sermons in his lifetime. He was an "itinerant" preacher, traveling from town to town in England, setting up Methodist societies.

In the days of Francis Asbury, the first of two Methodist bishops in the United States, a pastor — most often a circuit rider — might be appointed to half of a state or more. His appointment might be for only three months, after which he moved to another circuit. Thousands of the oldest United Methodist congregations today trace their history to a circuit rider.


This traveling from place to place to begin Methodist societies in principle led to the itinerant system The United Methodist Church uses today.

"Itinerancy" refers specifically to the commitment by pastors to go and serve wherever their bishops send them. "Appointment" is the action taken by bishops. These are different, yet related.

Before they are ordained or licensed, clergy in The United Methodist Church agree to serve where their bishop appoints them. Appointments are for one year at a time. For elders and local pastors, particularly, the goal is to match the gifts and graces of the particular pastor with the ministry needs of a particular congregation. In this "serial leadership" of consecutive pastors – no two are alike – over time, the combination of skills blends to form a broad base of developed ministries.

While bishops make appointments, they incorporate a consultative process outlined in The Book of Discipline that includes district superintendents, pastors and pastor and staff/parish relations committees. The needs and desires of clergy are considered, says Missouri Bishop Robert Schnase, but "the mission of the church comes first."

- **Did you know?** Our UMM is the only organized United Methodist Men's organization in our sixchurch Cluster. Our group is chartered by the National Methodist Men's organization.

MINISTERIAL UPDATES by Chuck and Betty Ashton

Betty and I pastor several ministries extending from the **First United Methodist Church of Arroyo Grande.** They all came about in our attempts to help those in need within our community. We sincerely feel that this is our effort to carry out the wishes of our Lord, Jesus Christ. We are aided in these endeavors by a number of individuals who share our beliefs. We all firmly believe that charity begins at home, namely within our community.

The FUMC Emergency Food Pantry is a prime example of our ministries. Each Monday at Criswell Hall from 1 PM to 3 PM we dispense basically a week's supply of food to families and individuals whose incomes fall short of their needs. We obtain the bulk of the food from the South County Food Bank due to its reasonable costs. We also get food from the Salvation Army and WALMART's resources that are unavailable at the Food Bank. We provide them with fresh produce, bakery items, meats, delicatessen, dry groceries, milk and juices when available. It takes us several trips on different days to accumulate the food for the Monday giveaways. Nothing is required of the clients but a head count as to the number of adults and children we are servicing to be included in our quarterly report to the Food Bank. There is no limit as to attendance though we have observed no one abusing our benevolence, and new faces are appearing all the time. So far this year we have provided food to 1,463 families, which consisted of 4,603 individuals, including 1,690 children.

Our People's Kitchen lunches is another of our community ministries. Twice a month on the first and third Wednesdays, we have a team that assembles a well-balanced sack lunch that includes two peanut butter and jelly sandwiches to be transported and handed out at the Ramona Gardens Park the next day, Thursday. We give out a minimum of 140+ sack lunches along with boxes of fresh fruit. No one goes without. We are told that some groups on the previous days have failed to provide enough meals. Year-to-date, we have provided 1,829 meals to 1,292 individuals.

Besides food, we also dispense new pairs of socks at our Thursday meals. It is the singularly most needed clothing item by individuals. We have been averaging 100 pairs at each meal. They are also given out at our Parking Lot Giveaways. We have given out 12,543 new pairs to date, making it an important ministry.

Finally, our quarterly **Parking Lot Giveaway** is an important ministry to our local community. Hundreds show up to obtain items for their needs. Thousands benefit by our benevolence. We have generally a team of 50 or more volunteers to help out. Many are recipients of our ministry.

All of this is made possible through the generosity of individuals, from within and outside the Church. Several of the various bodies within the Church have contributed. Our team volunteers have given hundreds of dollars. **Cal-Pac** gave us a \$700.00 check for the Emergency Food Pantry. **No monies** come from the Church's Budget or the Mission Team. All funds are used to benefit those in need. No one is compensated for their volunteer efforts or mileage.

If you want to support any of these ministries, financially or materially, see us at our table in Criswell Hall between Church services. You can designate how your funding is to be used. Special donation credit is given through the Church. We also have donation receipts available for tax purposes.


People's Kitchen Has A New Home

The Latest from the Trustees, July 2015

- Bernie, Mike T. and Paul cleaned up the Pastor's office walls and carpet. Bernie and Mike T. installed new light bulbs in the office as well. The bathroom will be painted in the near future.
- Paul will gather the Church Disaster Preparedness team together in the coming month to discuss moving forward with the Red Cross as a partner.
- We talked about how volunteers are still needed for the Social Hall paint party on Saturday, July 18. Most members of the board agreed to help out.
- The District Superintendent's office said they have no problem with where we install an American flag on the property. This issue now needs to go to our Church conference for a vote on the appropriateness of moving its location from the prior approval spot, outside the education wing, to the Church's yard facing Halcyon.

GOD'S STEADFAST LOVE...IN ACTION

1. MEET GARY AND CINDY MOON WITH THE AIDS
PROJECT IN THAILAND. They were commissioned in
October 2009 and assigned to open and direct Angel's
Haven Orphanage, a facility for children with HIV/AIDS
in Chiang Mai, Thailand (located about 420 miles north of
Bangkok). Angel's Haven opened in October 2010 to
provide a safe environment and personal care for some of
the open HIV/AIDS children in Thailand. It is among
the first social ministries of the church in Thailand,
where United Methodist mission work is a fairly recent
addition to the Southeast Asia Mission Initiative.

They are members of Covenant United Methodist Church, a Korean-American congregation in Pomona. They spent seven years in preparation for mission service after experiencing a call during a training program offered in Los Angeles by a Korea-based organization. Gary was a chiropractor by profession before entering full-time mission work.

The Moons provide support for about 20 boys and 20 girls from 1-20 years old who are infected with HIV in a government-run orphanage in Chiang Mai province. They were among 600 other healthy orphans and they were not getting any special attention, which they needed due to their illness.

They have been working with Baukjan Elementary School for the last five and half years. Last year they helped the school start a community development project which includes a mushroom farm, frog farm, fish farm, chicken farm, coffee farm, and vegetable garden. This is the second year, and the project is going very well. This year a whole student body is learning about how to manage and run the farms. This year students made some money by selling mushrooms to the villagers. We all hope to continue seeing good results for years to come.

2. LOCAL MISSION NEEDS We are blessed to have local mission ministries to help meet the needs of those in our own community, also. Five Cities Christian Women continues to have increases in persons served and can use our monetary help as well as staples. Our Food Pantry here at the church also continues to serve increased numbers. You can assist as a volunteer or make casseroles. Donations for the August 15 parking lot giveaway are appreciated as well as assistance that day.

Many hands continue to do many things.
