Happy New Year! I am sure everyone who was able to come, see, and hear the children in the "Christmas Program" were amazed at how wonderful the children shared the joy of Christmas cheer through traditional songs. Thank you to the staff and the children who spent many days practicing their songs for this event. Thank you to the families who brought goodies to share after the program and to the staff for their dedication in helping the children prepare for this fun family celebration. I would also like to thank David Bauer who ran the sound for the program.

2015 was a very busy year, with many fun filled events that fostered learning and friendships. I extend a heartfelt "THANK YOU" to all the families that have chosen our program. It is our desire to provide the best of quality care to children, by offering a low child to teacher ratio and an environment that is enriching, both inside and outside the classroom. The National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC) sets the standards of quality, which we follow and continue to guide the staff as they work on the NAEYC Accreditation Self-Study.

We have two upcoming family fun events planned. The first event will be another "Parent's Night Out" on Saturday, January 23, from 4-8 PM. The cost is \$25, per child, for four hours of child care (see the attached flier for details). Our second event will be the "Taco Bar Dinner and Rain Gutter Regatta Races" on Friday, February 27. The evening will start at 6:30 PM, with dinner, and the races will beginning around 7:00 PM. Both events will help the staff raise funds needed to attend the "California Association for the Education of Young Children" (CAEYC) conference in Pasadena. (Mark your calendars now because school will be closed, so staff are able to attend the conference, Thursday, March 31 and Friday, April 1). These events provide our families with another opportunity to have fun, build new friendships, and strengthen the heart of our school community.

The Fall Survey results are in. 95% of the Families were overall "very satisfied" and 5% were "satisfied" with our program. The number one reason why families chose our program was for the "age appropriate curriculum" and the second two reasons where for our "low child to teacher ratio" and for "socialization". Do you need extra care from time to time? If so, fill out an "Extra Care Form", then give it to your child's teacher. She will then give it to me, for approval. To assure space is available, 24 hour notice is preferable.

Do you need to change your child's contract? We understand that changes do occur for families. However, we do have a 30 day written notice policy, that is required, for families needing to make changes regarding their child care needs. There is always movement in childcare and spaces for children in our program are limited. With this policy in place, when a space does open up for another family, AGUMCC has ample time to notify a new family, so they too can join our program.
